ABC – Approved Budget for the Contract.

BAC – Bids and Awards Committee.

Bid – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[c])

Bidder – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[d])

Bidding Documents – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[e])

BIR – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

BSP – Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

Consulting Services – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to: (i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[i])

CDA - Cooperative Development Authority.

Contract – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

CIF – Cost Insurance and Freight.

CPI – Consumer Price Index.

DDP – Refers to the quoted price of the Goods, which means "delivered duty paid."

DTI – Department of Trade and Industry.

EXW - Ex works.

FCA – "Free Carrier" shipping point.

FOB – "Free on Board" shipping point.

Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project— Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

Framework Agreement – Refers to a written agreement between a procuring entity and a supplier or service provider that identifies the terms and conditions, under which specific purchases, otherwise known as "Call-Offs," are made for the duration of the agreement. It is in the nature of an option contract between the procuring entity and the bidder(s) granting the procuring entity the option to either place an order for any of the goods or services identified in the Framework Agreement List or not buy at all, within a minimum period of one (1) year to a maximum period of three (3) years. GFI – Government Financial Institution.

GOCC – Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

Goods – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term "related" or "analogous services" shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[r])

INCOTERMS – International Commercial Terms.

INVITATION TO BID "Procurement of Cleaning Services for the Air-conditioning Units in DBM Buildings I, II and III, and Arcache Building"

- 1. The Department of Budget and Management (DBM), through the FY 2023 General Appropriations Act, intends to apply the sum of Four Million Nine Hundred Fifty-One Thousand Pesos (P4,951,000.00) being the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract for the "Procurement of Cleaning Services for the Air-conditioning Units in DBM Buildings I, II and III, and Arcache Building" (Project ID No. DBM-2023-03). For the purpose of early procurement authorized under Section 7.6 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184, the proposed budget under the FY 2023 National Expenditure Program shall be used as basis. Further, consistent with the requirement in the same Section 7.6, no award of contract shall be made until the approval and effectivity of the FY 2023 General Appropriations Act. The period for the performance of the obligations under the Contract shall not go beyond the validity of the appropriation for the Project. Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
- 2. The DBM now invites bids for the above-entitled Procurement Project. Delivery of the Goods is required as specified in Section VI (Schedule of Requirements) of the Bidding Documents. Bidders should have completed within the period of December 6, 2017 to December 5, 2022 a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
- 3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion as specified in the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
 - Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.
- 4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from the DBM-Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) Secretariat through the contact details given below and inspect the

Bidding Documents as posted on the websites of the DBM and the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS).

5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders on November 15, 2022 from the given address and website below and upon payment of a fee in the amount of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00).

Payment may be made in either mode, as follows:

a) Online payment through the Landbank Link.Biz Portal. However, this mode of payment may only be done until December 2, 2022 (four [4] calendar days before the Submission of Bids), 11:00 p.m., for crediting and recording purposes. Procedural guidelines for online payment may be accessed via https://dbm.gov.ph/images/Advisory_for_Bidders_Suppliers-LinkBiz.pdf.

Bidders shall present its confirmation receipt to the BAC Secretariat in person, by facsimile, or through electronic means, which shall be used as proof of payment for the bidding documents fee.

- b) Payment, in person, to the DBM-Cash Division, through the BAC Secretariat, DBM-Administrative Service-Procurement Management Division, Ground Floor, DBM Building III, General Solano St., San Miguel, Manila. The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees which will be presented in person, by facsimile, or through electronic means.
- 6. The DBM will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on November 22, 2022, 9:30 a.m., which shall be open to prospective bidders.

To reduce the risks and hazards of community transmission of COVID-19, the DBM-BAC shall conduct meetings and conferences via video-conferencing until further notice, or until such time that the state of calamity, or implementation of community quarantine or similar government restrictions shall have been lifted by the proper government authorities.

The prospective bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx, and wait for further advice to join the BAC meeting room, the link of which shall be provided to the prospective bidders before the start of the Pre-Bid Conference.

- 7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat or the DBM-Central Records Division through manual submission at the office address indicated below on or before December 6, 2022, 9:30 a.m. Late bids shall not be accepted.
- 8. All Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB** Clause 14.
- 9. Bid opening shall be on December 6, 2022, 9:30 a.m., at the given address below and via video conferencing. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity. Authorized attendees, including representatives of bidders, who are physically present at the BAC Conference Room,

DBM Building III, General Solano St., San Miguel, Manila shall likewise join the meeting via videoconferencing.

Bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx, and wait for further advice to join the BAC meeting room, the link of which shall be provided to the bidders before the start of bid opening.

The DBM reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, Department of Budget and Management, wishes to receive Bids for the "Procurement of Cleaning Services for the Air-conditioning Units in DBM Buildings I, II and III, and Arcache Building" with Project Identification No. DBM-2023-03.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is composed of one (1) lot, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for FY 2023 in the amount of **Four Million Nine Hundred Fifty-One Thousand Pesos** (**P4,951,000.00**). The period for the performance of the obligations under the Contract shall not go beyond the validity of the appropriation for the Project.
- 2.2. The source of funding is the FY 2023 General Appropriations Act. For the purpose of early procurement authorized under Section 7.6 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, the proposed budget under the FY 2023 National Expenditure Program shall be used as basis.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 Revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. Foreign ownership limited to those allowed under the rules may participate in this Project.
- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, the Bidder shall have an SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project, the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be equivalent to the following requirements:
 - a. The bidder must have completed a single contract that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC, or
 - b. The bidder must have completed at least two (2) similar contracts:
 - i. The aggregate amount of which should be equivalent to at least *fifty* percent (50%) of the ABC for this Project; **and**
 - ii. The largest of these similar contracts must be equivalent to at least half of the percentage of the ABC as required above (i.e., twenty-five percent [25%]).
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under **ITB** Clause 18.

7. Subcontracts

The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that subcontracting is not allowed.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The DBM will hold a Pre-Bid Conference for this Project on November 22, 2022, 9:30 a.m., as indicated in paragraph 6 of the **IB**.

To reduce the risks and hazards of community transmission of COVID-19, the DBM-BAC shall conduct meetings and conferences via video conferencing until further

notice, or until such time that the state of calamity, or implementation of community quarantine or similar government restrictions shall have been lifted by the proper government authorities.

The prospective bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, **https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx**, and wait for further advice from the BAC Secretariat to join the BAC meeting link, which shall be provided to the prospective bidders before the start of the Pre-Bid Conference.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the DBM, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section VIII** (Checklist of Technical and Financial **Documents**).
- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in **ITB** Clause 5.3 should have been completed within the period of December 6, 2017 to December 5, 2022.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section VIII** (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.

11.4. For Foreign-funded Procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Bid Prices

Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:

- a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - i. The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, ex-warehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
 - iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
 - iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in e.
- b. For Goods offered from abroad:
 - i. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the price of the Goods shall be quoted delivered duty paid (DDP) with the place of destination in the Philippines as specified in the **BDS**. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.
 - ii. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, as listed in **Section VII (Technical Specifications).**

13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

14. Bid Security

14.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.

14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid until **April 5**, **2023**. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one (1) copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the **IB**.

17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

18. Domestic Preference

The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.
- 19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in **Section VII** (**Technical Specifications**), although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the **BDS** for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.
- 19.4. The Project shall be awarded as one (1) Project having several items that shall be awarded as one (1) contract.
- 19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder. For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post-Qualification

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

Thereafter, a DBM-BAC representative will draw the raffle in an order wherein the first drawn bidder shall be considered as the winning LCRB and awarded the contract. The second drawn bidder shall be the second ranked LCRB, and so on until all LCRBs are drawn and ranked. In case of the failure, refusal or inability of the winning LCRB to submit the documents required under Section 37.1 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or to enter into contract and post the required Performance Security, as provided in Section 40 of the same IRR, the BAC shall disqualify the said LCRB, and shall proceed to award the contract to the second ranked LCRB. This procedure shall be repeated until a Notice to Proceed has been issued.

Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 Revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC).**

2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

- 2.1. Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the **SCC**.

3. Performance Security

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than prior to the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

4. Inspection and Tests

The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Project specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity in accordance with the Generic Procurement Manual. In addition to tests in the SCC, Section IV (Technical Specifications) shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires, and where they are to be conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

5. Warranty

- 5.1 In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 5.2 The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

6. Liability of the Supplier

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Supplier is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

The packaging shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packaging case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the Goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

The packaging, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the Contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified below, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the Procuring Entity.

The outer packaging must be clearly marked on at least four (4) sides as follows:

Transportation

Where the Supplier is required under Contract to deliver the Goods CIF, CIP, or DDP, transport of the Goods to the port of destination or such other named place of destination in the Philippines, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged and paid for by the Supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the Contract Price.

Where the Supplier is required under this Contract to transport the Goods to a specified place of destination within the Philippines, defined as the Project Site, transport to such place of destination in the Philippines, including insurance and storage, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged by the Supplier, and related costs shall be included in the contract price.

Where the Supplier is required under Contract to deliver the Goods CIF, CIP or DDP, Goods are to be transported on carriers of Philippine registry. In the event that no carrier of Philippine registry is available, Goods may be shipped by a carrier which is not of Philippine registry provided that the Supplier obtains and presents to the Procuring Entity certification to this effect from the nearest Philippine consulate to the port of dispatch. In the event that carriers of Philippine registry are available but their schedule delays the Supplier in its performance of this Contract the period from when the Goods were first ready for shipment and the actual date of shipment the period of delay will be considered force majeure.

The Procuring Entity accepts no liability for the damage of Goods during transit other than those prescribed by INCOTERMS for DDP deliveries. In the case of Goods supplied from within the Philippines or supplied by domestic Suppliers risk and title will not be deemed to have passed to the Procuring Entity until their receipt and final acceptance at the final destination.

Intellectual Property Rights

The Supplier shall indemnify the Procuring Entity against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the Goods or any part thereof.

- In order to proceed with the payment process, the bidder must submit the following documents in case they were not submitted during the deadline for the submission of bidding documents/post-qualification stage/contract signing stage, as applicable:
 - a. Notarized Omnibus Sworn Statement in lieu of the submitted unnotarized Omnibus Sworn Statement; and

Detailed Technical Specifications

1.0 Provision of Cleaning Services for Air-conditioning Units

a. Minimum Qualifications of Service Provider

- i. Accreditation/Certification/Licensing
 - The service provider shall have DTI Accreditation on Refrigeration and Air-conditioning Repair and Service Enterprises, proof of which shall be submitted during post-qualification.
 - The service provider, in the performance of its services, shall secure and maintain at its own expense all registration, licenses or permits required by law, and shall comply with all pertinent rules and regulations.

ii. Experience

- The service provider must have at least one (1) year experience in airconditioner (AC) cleaning or maintenance with emphasis on commercial AC system cleaning and/or decontamination, proof of which shall be submitted during post-qualification;
- The service provider shall have a minimum of two (2) Air-conditioning System Specialists on a full-time basis, proof of which shall be submitted during post-qualification;

iii. Equipment, Materials, and Labor

- The service provider shall provide all the necessary equipment, materials, and labor to adequately perform the specified services.
- The service provider shall ensure that its employees have received safety equipment and training, as required for the work by the Occupational Safety and Health Standards.
- The service provider shall maintain a copy of all current safety documentation/certification within the DBM premises during contract implementation.

b. Air-conditioning Units Covered

The air-conditioning units to be covered by the cleaning services are specified in Annex "B".1

c. Provision of Workers

- i. The workers to be assigned by the service provider to perform the cleaning activities should meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - TESDA-Certified Technician or its equivalent; and
 - With at least two (2) years of experience in air-conditioning units cleaning and/or maintenance.

¹ A total of 432 air-conditioning units are to be serviced from January to March 2023, while 589 air-conditioning units are to be serviced from April to December 2023. The quantity of the air-conditioning units reflected is for bidding purposes only. During contract implementation, the DBM-AS may adjust the actual number of units requiring cleaning services, as well as the cleaning schedule. In such case, a corresponding adjustment in the actual amount payable shall be applicable, as may be warranted.

- ii. The service provider shall assign one (1) safety officer with the following minimum qualifications:
 - Safety Officer 2 Basics/Constructions Occupational Safety and Health (BOSH/COSH SO2) Training Certificate accredited by Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE); and
 - With at least one (1) year of experience as Safety Officer.
- iii. The service provider shall assign one (1) Engineer for the supervision of cleaning activities. Said Engineer should meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - With at least two (2) years of experience in Air-conditioning Units Cleaning and/or Maintenance
 - Licensed Mechanical Engineer
- iv. The service provider shall assign only the workers who tested negative in the RT-PCR/Antigen test for COVID-19 conducted not earlier than three (3) calendar days before deployment to the DBM for the scheduled cleaning activities.

Proof of compliance to the corresponding qualifications of workers shall be submitted to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Administrative Service-General Services Division (AS-GSD), during contract implementation.

2.0 Scope of Work

a. Submission of Work Plan

The service provider shall submit a work plan, within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice to Proceed, based on initial assessment/inspection of the airconditioning units as indicated in Annex B, for approval of the DBM-AS Director, which identifies the following:

- Monthly and quarterly cleaning activities;
- Cleaning methodology/process to be undertaken and the cleaning agents/chemical products which will be used;
- Special requirements needed for cleaning (e.g., equipment);
- Monthly and quarterly schedule;
- List of personnel to be assigned in the project with the individual information sheets, medical certificates, training certificates, proof of certification/specialization issued by competent authority;
- Safety plan; and
- Other concerns.

The service provider may revise the work plan, as may be required by the AS.

b. Implementation of Work Plan

The service provider shall implement the work plan based on the DBM-AS approved schedule of activities. It is understood that all tools and/or equipment necessary in the conduct of cleaning activities shall be provided by the Contractor.

c. Submission of Monthly Report

The service provider shall submit a monthly and quarterly accomplishment reports to the AS-GSD within five (5) calendar days upon completion of scheduled monthly/quarterly cleaning activities

d. Conduct of Cleaning Inspections

The service provider shall conduct a post cleaning inspection and verification process jointly with AS-GSD personnel/representative.

3.0 Service Standards and Conditions

- a. The service provider shall be responsible for the removal of visible surface contaminants and deposits from within the AC system in accordance with the approved DBM-AS work plan and the technical specifications.
 - i. The AC system includes any interior surface facility's air distribution system for conditioned spaces and/or occupied zones. Details of the scope of work for this project shall be also included in the approved work plan.
 - ii. The service provider shall provide all tools and equipment necessary to render a satisfactory level of service, free of charge.

b. AC System Component Inspection and Site Preparation

- i. Prior to the commencement of any cleaning work, the service provider shall perform visual inspection of the AC system to determine appropriate methods, tools and equipment to satisfactorily complete/provide services. Damaged system components found during inspection shall be documented and submitted to DBM-AS.
- ii. The service provider shall also conduct a site evaluation, and establish a specific coordinated plan that details how each area of the building will be protected during the implementation of the monthly/quarterly work plan cleaning activities.

c. AC System Cleaning Requirements

- i. The service provider shall ensure that debris/wastes removed during the cleaning shall be collected and properly disposed.
- ii. The service provider shall employ measures to control odors and/or mist vapors during the cleaning process.
- iii. The service provider shall employ cleaning methods such that all AC systems components must be visibly clean.
- iv. The service provider shall, upon completion of the cleaning activity, ensure that all components must be returned to settings recorded prior to the cleaning operations.
- v. The service provider shall ensure that dampers and any air-directional mechanical devices inside the AC System must have their position marked prior to cleaning and, upon completion, must be restored to their marked position.
- vi. The service provider may remove and re-install ceiling sections to gain access to AC Systems during the cleaning process.

- vii. The service provider may utilize service openings, as required for proper cleaning at various points of the AC system.
- viii. The service provider shall clean all air distribution devices using safe cleaning solutions and water.
- ix. The service provider shall ensure all visible surface contamination deposits shall be removed.
- x. The service provider shall clean all indoor fan coil unit (FCU) and components, and air-conditioning (AC) outdoor units. Fans, coils and condensate pans shall be chemically cleaned and pressured washed.

d. Occupational Safety and Protection

- i. The service provider shall ensure the safety of the facility occupants, the facility itself, and the workers performing the cleaning services.
- ii. The service provider shall comply with all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Standards and other local and national requirements for protecting the safety of its employees including the use of personal protective equipment (PPE).
- iii. The service provider shall ensure that no process or materials shall be employed that will introduce hazards in the occupied spaces.
- iv. During the AC system cleaning procedures, the service provider shall ensure and provide appropriate engineering controls. The engineering controls are demonstrated by appropriate monitoring of a certified AC Specialist.
- v. The service provider shall ensure that all furniture, flooring, computers, photocopiers and other equipment should be covered with clean protective coverings before beginning the work.

e. Cleaning Methodology

- i. The service provider shall use cleaning methodology that is most suitable with the AC brand.
- ii. The service provider shall ensure that no cleaning methodology shall be used that could potentially damage components of the AC system or negatively alter the integrity of the system.
- iii. The service provider shall report immediately to DBM-AS if there are evidence of damage, deterioration, delaminating, friable material, mold or fungus growth, or moisture such that fibrous glass materials cannot be restored by cleaning.
- iv. In the cleaning of coils, the service provider may use any cleaning methodology that will render the coil visibly clean. However, the contractor shall ensure that cleaning methodology employed will not cause any damage to, displacement of, or erosion of the coil surface or fins.
- v. Biocidal agents and coatings shall only be applied if active fungal growth is reasonably suspected or fungal contamination have been verified through testing. When used, it shall be applied in strict accordance with manufacturer recommendation.

f. Verification

Cleanliness verification for the AC System shall be performed jointly by the service provider and the DBM-AS within one (1) working day after every scheduled cleaning activity.

g. Post-Cleaning Report

The service provider shall submit to the DBM-AS the result of the verification and findings on systems found to be damaged and/or in need of repair immediately after every scheduled cleaning activity.

h. Liability of the Service Provider

- i. The service provider shall be held liable and shall be charged for:
 - a. Any work-related damage caused by mishandling of the air-conditioning unit/s or any DBM property; or
 - b. Any work-related accident or illness inflicted by and to any DBM employee or their own personnel during contract implementation.

4.0 Payment Terms

The service provider shall submit the monthly billing statement together with the postcleaning reports, duly approved by the AS-GSD.

5.0 Performance Review and Assessment

The AS shall conduct a mid-term performance review and assessment of the performance of the service provider. Based on its assessment, the DBM may terminate the contract for failure of the service provider or to perform its obligations therein.
