Special Provision(s)

- 1. Mational Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Program. The amount of Fifteen Billion Seven Hundred Fifty Five Million Pesos (P15.755.000.000) appropriated herein for Purposes 1, 2 and 3 may be used for:
- a) Reconstruction, rehabilitation, repair, aid, relief and other works or services, including pre-disaster activities, in connection with the occurrence of natural calamities, epidemics as declared by the DOH, crises resulting from armed conflicts, insurgency, terrorism, and other catastrophes occuring in the current or two (2) preceding years.

Reconstruction or rehabilitation projects shall be implemented by the DPWH and other national government agencies which may delegate the same to LGUs with the capability to implement said projects by administration or by contract, through the execution of a NOA;

- b) Additional funding source of the Quick Response Fund (QRF) of the implementing agency concerned when the balance thereof has reached a critical level, subject to approval by the DBM; and
- c) One Billion Pesos (P1,000,000,000) for the insurance coverage of government facilities against natural calamities. The insurance shall be with the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) and subject to the guidelines to be issued by DBM, DOF and GSIS.

Release of funds shall be made directly to the implementing agencies in accordance with the approval of the President of the Philippines, who may take into consideration the recommendation of the Mational Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) for local disasters or the appropriate agency for international crises. The MDRRMC shall consider the donations or grants received by agencies in support of calamities in making the foregoing recommendation.

The agency concerned shall submit to the DBM, the MDRRMC, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Finance and the COA, either in printed form or by way of electronic document, quarterly reports on the utilization of funds. The head of the agency concerned and the agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the said quarterly reports are likewise posted on the official website of the agency concerned.

2. Quick Response Fund. The amounts appropriated herein under Purpose 1 and 2 at Three Billion Pesos (P3,000,000,000) each shall be used for the initial allocation of QRF of the following core agencies, and such other agencies that may be given QRF:

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The QRF shall serve as a stand-by fund to be used for relief and rehabilitation programs and projects, including pre-positioning of goods, emergency response units, and other allied support items and equipment in order that the situation and living conditions of people in communities or areas stricken by calamities, epidemics, crises, and catastrophes, which occurred in the current year or the last two (2) preceding years may be normalized as quickly as possible. In no case shall the QRF be used for pre-disaster activities, such as conduct of training, insurance of assets, and public information and information initiatives, or any other purpose not authorized in this provision.

Release of funds for the abovementioned core agencies shall be automatically released upon the effectivity of this Act. While release of QRF for other agencies shall be subject to the submission of a favorable recommendation of the MDRRMC and approval of the NDRM

Additional QRF may be given to the agency with existing QRF allocation when the balance thereof has reached a critical level, subject to approval by the DBM.

In no case shall the QRF allocations of the agencies concerned be given to other agencies.

The agency concerned shall submit to the DBM, the MDRRNC, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, either in printed form or by way of electronic document, quarterly reports on the status of the utilization of the QRF. The head of the agency concerned and the agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are likewise posted on the official website of the agency concerned. 3. Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Fund. The amount of One Billion Five Hundred Million Pesos (P1,500,000,000) appropriated herein shall be used by the departments, bureaus, and offices of the National Government, including Constitutional Offices enjoying fiscal autonomy, SUCs, GOCCs, and LGUs exclusively for rehabilitation and reconstruction projects damaged by various calamities which cannot be covered by the regular NDRRM Fund. Releases from said amount shall be made directly to the implementing agencies or LGUs in accordance with the approval of the President of the Philippines who may take into consideration the recommendation of the Mational Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC).

The agency concerned shall submit to the DBM, the MDRRMC, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Finance, and the COA, either in printed form or by way of electronic document, quarterly reports on the utilization of funds. The head of the agency concerned and the agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the said quarterly reports are likewise posted on the official website of the agency concerned. 4. Appropriatons under the Mational Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund. Modification of funds within the purpose authorized herein shall be subject to approval of the DBM.
