The old adage "It is more blessed to give than to receive" still rings true during this challenging period, most especially during the Christmas Season. It does not matter whether it's a sustainable effort or more of a momentary sharing of resources, what is important is the opportunity to help, uplift, and support others especially in these trying times.

To usher in the season of giving, the DBM Regional Office XIII, through its Gender and Development Focal Persons, reached out to the Bethany Home of the Missionary Sisters of Mary, Inc., a shelter facility that houses about 20 female residents between the ages of 11-20 years old. The activity sought to make young victims of domestic abuse experience the joy of Christmas.

December 1, 2021 – It was a rainy afternoon, but that didn't dampen the enthusiasm of the staff while travelling east towards Barangay Baan, Butuan City. At the venue, the residents' timid but warm energy greeted the group. They were excited to welcome visitors again, as visits have been scarce since the onset of the pandemic.

"It is my hope that this activity will foster an atmosphere of sharing and that the Christmas spirit of joy will come alive throughout the afternoon. I believe that our lives will be enriched by giving what we can and by spending time building friendships with all of you," said Regional Director (RD) Maria Fe Jagna in her message to the residents, houseparents, teachers, and Administrator of the institution.

True enough, the sharing went beyond the prepared meals and gift packs as personnel immersed themselves in the little community for a few hours. There was overwhelming support for the transition projects made by the wards and gift items were quickly bought by the afternoon's guests. Soon, the Activity Center became a stage for lively performances from the talented young wards and guests while games with prizes were played alongside music and laughter that had not been heard and enjoyed by the beneficiaries in a long time.

The DBM personnel handed out gift packs to the young girls as Christmas carols were sung in the background. It was a heartwarming scene as faces lit up each time an orange bag was handed to a kid. One child, failing to contain her happiness, suddenly hugged a staff and said a warm "thank you!" The shared meal sealed the joy of fellowship on that day.

The Outreach Program was not just about bringing joy to the residents. The visitors left Bethany Home with hearts full of love and joy, fulfillment, and rekindled spirits for the coming Advent Season.
