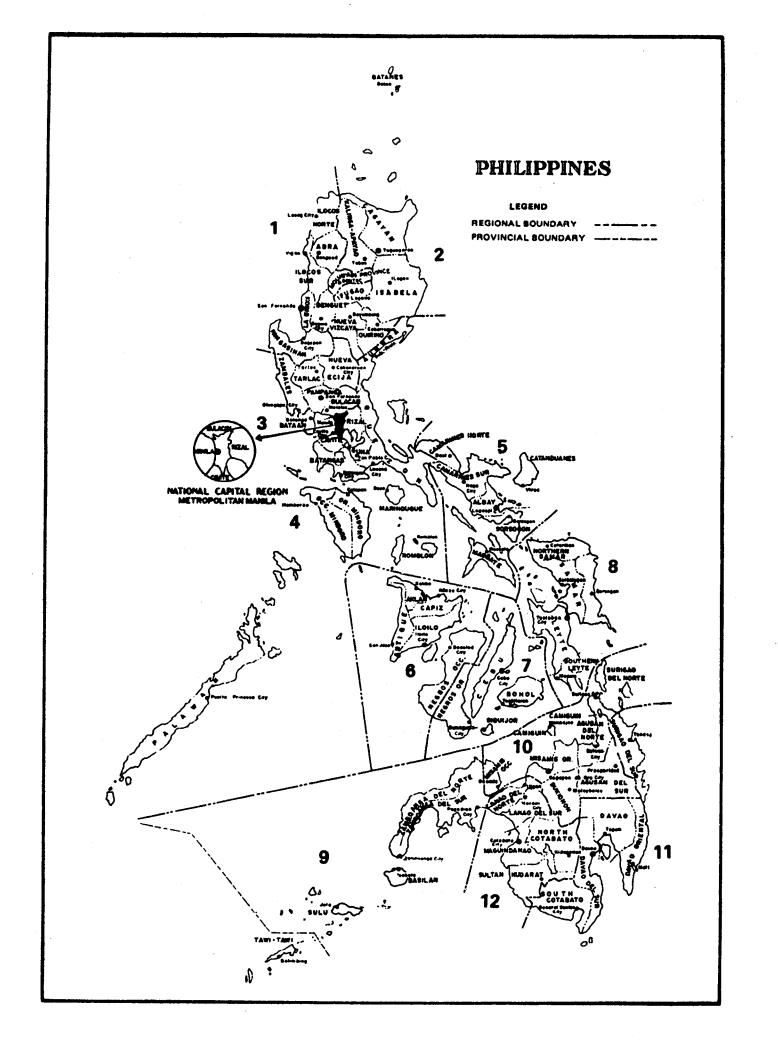

BUDGET OF RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES PURSUANT TO THE PROGRAM OF GOVERNMENT AS APPROVED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES FOR 1986

The submission of this document is in fulfillment of the requirement of Section 16 (1), Article VIII of the Philippine Constitution: "The Prime Minister shall submit to the Batasang Pambansa within thirty days from the opening of each regular session, as the basis of the general appropriations bill, a budget of receipts based on existing and proposed revenue measures, and of expenditures." This document, the Budget of Receipts and Expenditures (BRE), presents the quantitative details of and rationale for the government's fiscal program to support the general appropriations proposal. It presents the revenue and borrowing programs or the "the budget of receipts" and the expenditure program both on cash and obligation (that is, accrual) bases and identifies the obligation budget components that are automatically and annually appropriated.

This document also discusses the salient features of the obligation budget program, as well as the major projects of the national government, and presents some special budgetary dimensions on regional development, foreign loan assisted projects, special accounts, debt service, and outstanding debt. All these are presented in Sections I, II, and III. Sections IV and V, on the other hand, expound on the highlights of the financial statements of government corporations and local government units, respectively.

In line with the total resource budget concept as provided for in Section V of PD 1177, this document includes an "aggregated public sector account" in Section VI which describes the total receipts and expenditures of the national government, local government units, and major nonfinancial government corporations.

A set of detailed supporting tables, with technical notes that help clarify concepts and explain the derivation of the relevant tables, and a glossary of terms are also presented to facilitate an understanding of the budget.

Overview of the National Government Budget

OVERVIEW OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT BUDGET

A. Obligation Budget Program Aggregates (Table A1.1)

The 1986 obligation budget program, which reflects the extent of expenditures that can be supported by receipts, embodies the government's policy of fiscal restraint implemented since late 1982. It represents a moderate expansion of 11.1 percent compared to the 23.4 percent expected in 1985. The obligation budget-to-Gross National Product (GNP) ratios are 12.3 percent and 12.1 percent, respectively, for 1985 and 1986. If debt service is netted out, the proposed 1986 budget will exhibit a real growth of 1.0 percent compared to the 4.5 percent reduction this year. The respective obligation budget-to-GNP ratios are 9.0 percent and 9.2 percent.

The real growth of the 1986 budget of 1.0 percent pales in comparison with the corresponding average annual expansion of around 6.0 percent from 1980 to 1982, a period characterized by aggressive fiscal policy aimed at stimulating economic growth despite a revenue effort, that is, the ratio of national government's revenues to GNP, that was on a downtrend primarily on account of the import tariff reductions.

The proportional share of current expenses to the total budget net of debt service and lending account in 1986 is 79.5 percent, higher than 75.5 percent and 79.2 percent share in 1984 and 1985, respectively. This is primarily due to the necessity of adequately maintaining our infrastructure base and preventing a further real decline in government compensation. The current operating expenses net of interest payments will amount to **P**47.0 billion in 1986. Debt service will reach **P**23.5 billion broken down into **P**14.9 billion interest payments and the balance of **P**8.6 billion is for debt amortization.

The ratio of capital outlays to the total budget will slightly increase from 12.7 percent in 1985 to 13 percent in 1986. The capital outlays of the Ministry of Public Works and Highways (MPWH) and the Ministry of Transportation and Communications (MTC) will be limited to $\mathbb{P}4.1$ billion. Equity requirements, particularly of nonfinancial government corporations, will decline from a peak of $\mathbb{P}10.8$ billion in 1981 to $\mathbb{P}1.7$ billion in 1985 and further to a low $\mathbb{P}1.2$ billion in 1986 with the ongoing implementation of measures to improve corporate financial performance. Other capital outlays will reach $\mathbb{P}6.8$ billion in 1986. The projected lending account, a provision for advances on the debts of government corporations particularly government financial institutions, is $\mathbb{P}10.2$ billion.

Technical Notes

The lending account, which basically consists of advances on government corporate loans, is an automatically appropriated account by virtue of PD 1177 and PD 1967 and is shown as part of both the obligation expenditure and the cash disbursement programs, for consistency in presentation. (The detailed reconciliation of the said programs are shown in Table A1.3.) For purposes of comparability in the presentation of the 1984, 1985, and 1986 levels, the 1984 equity to government financial institutions has been shown under the lending account, which is presented on a net basis, that is, gross lending net of loan collection for the same period.

By virtue of Sections 38(f), 42 and 43 of Presidential Decree (PD) 1177, the budgetary program may be adjusted by the Executive Branch to account for unforseen events, such as revenue shortfalls, a significantly higher Cash Disbursement Ceiling (CDC) utilization rate, errors in the forecasting of net lending accounts, and unanticipated changes in interest rates and foreign exchange rates which obviously exert an upward disbursement pressure, among others.

The 1984 figures are actual obligations incurred while those for 1985 and 1986 are estimates. The statement applies to all other tables.

B. The Obligation Budget Program in Relation to the Appropriation Proposal (Table A1.2)

Around P38.8 billion or 41.8 percent of the 1986 obligation program is already authorized under existing laws. These automatically appropriated expenditures and the corresponding laws are as follows: a) "fixed expenditures' or the GSIS retirement premium as authorized under PD 1177; b) authorizations for projects in the Public Works Act, sometimes called "continuing appropriations"; c) special accounts and fiduciary funds authorized in PD 1234, among others; d) debt service expenditures under RA 4860; and, e) advances on guaranteed debts, among others, as provided under PD 1177 and PD 1967.

The remaining $\mathbf{P}54.1$ billion of the obligation program will be covered by the proposed General Appropriations measure, which amounts to $\mathbf{P}69.4$ billion now being presented to the Batasan for consideration. The difference represents the "unprogrammed" component, a standby legislative spending authority which may be used under the following conditions: a) when cash receipts exceed original projections thus allowing more expenditures for programs and projects; b) when projects and activities to be funded are essential and emergency in character; and, c) if the fiscal and monetary targets consistent with the economic recovery program will not be violated. A good example of the need for this standby spending authority relates to the Economic Support Fund (ESF). Since the Fund is subject to the approval of the US Congress, the figures incorporated in the budget program are best estimates. If a higher amount is eventually remitted by the US government during the budget execution stage, the legislative authority for spending the originally unanticipated amount is the unprogrammed appropriation.

C. The Obligation Budget Program in Relation to Cash Disbursements and Receipts (Tables A1.3-A1.5)

An overriding concern of fiscal policy is the control of the national government's budgetary deficit, that is, cash revenues less cash disbursements net of repayment of principal. The aim is to maintain a manageable level that does not unduly exert pressure on the balance of payment deficit and on inflationary sources of borrowings. The target budget deficit in 1986 is P6.9 billion or 0.9 percent of GNP, a sharp decline from the 1982 level of P14.4 billion or 4.3 percent of GNP.

Technical Notes

The flow of transactions from obligation to cash, is summarized as follows: 1) the release of obligational authority through Advice of Allotments (AA), the ceiling for which is the "Obligation Program"; 2) the utilization of AAs or the incurrence of obligation; 3) the release of cash authorizations through CDCs, the ceiling for which is the cash authorization program; 4) the utilization of cash authorizations or the issuance of checks in payment for obligations incurred; and, 5) the encashment of checks or withdrawal of cash from the Bureau of Treasury.

Given the aforementioned flow, it is apparent that obligations would be higher than their corresponding current budget cash disbursements due to the time lag involved from the time obligations are incurred up to the actual cash payment of expenditures. Payments made during the year arising from prior years' obligations are added to the current budget cash disbursement to arrive at cash disbursements net of the repayment of principal.

"Expected generation of accounts payable" column is the difference between the current budget expected utilization of allotment advices and the current budget expected utilization of cash authorization. On the other hand, "encashment of checks issued in 1986" column is the difference between the current budget and accounts payable expected utilization of cash authorization and the current budget and accounts payable cash disbursement.

The adjustment on sinking fund transactions is the difference between debt amortization, a concept on an obligation basis and the repayment of principal, a cash concept. The following distinguishes debt amortization from the repayment of principal:

1. Reconciliation of the Obligation Budget and the Cash Disbrusement Program

The 1986 obligation expenditure program is higher than its corresponding current budget cash disbursement because of the following: a) not all the allotments (effected by the release document called Advice of Allotment or AA) corresponding to the obligation ceiling are utilized by the agencies; b) not all obligations incurred during the year require cash disbursement releases, in currency and in checks (effected by the release document called Cash Disbursement Ceiling or CDC) in the same year; c) not all current budget CDCs are utilized; and, d) not all checks issued during the year are encashed in the same year.

Technical Notes

To facilitate the consolidation of the public sector cash budget (that is, for the national government, government corporations, and local government units) the national government's foreign project loans covered by relending agreements with government corporations are treated like direct corporate loans guaranteed by the national government, so that the proceeds for the said foreign loans are recorded only once in the government corporate books. Such loans that fall due and are paid for by the national government form part of the lending account, which in turn is booked by government corporations as a shift in their liability from the foreign creditor to the national government.

Foreign project loans contracted by the national government and the proceeds of which have been given to government corporations without any relending agreement are treated differently. The proceeds from these loans given to corporations are recorded as a financing item in the national government's cash budget program and as an "above-the-deficit-line disbursement," either as an automatically appropriated equity or a lending account by virtue of RA 4860. The repayment of these loans forms part of the debt service program of the national government.

Around 89.7 percent of the P87.5 billion disbursements net of debt repayment is the projected cash payments arising from the 1986 obligation budget program. The balance represents disbursements on prior year's account consisting of accounts payable and the expected 1986 encashment of checks issued in 1985.

Around 99.8 percent of the AA program and 98.4 percent of the current budget CDC are expected to be utilized. This implies a gross generation of accounts payable equivalent to $\mathbf{P}1.7$ billion in 1986. Given a $\mathbf{P}5.1$ billion indicative provision for the payment of past accounts, the end 1986 level of outstanding accounts payable will likely be less than the corresponding end 1985 level by as much as $\mathbf{P}3.4$ billion.

2. Cash Receipts

Revenue generation efforts in 1986 are expected to raise the revenue yield to P80.7 billion, or an increase of 5.1 percent over the P76.7 billion adjusted level in 1985. The corresponding ratio of revenues to GNP will further decline from 11.3 percent in 1985 to 10.5 percent in 1986.

A distinguishing feature of the 1986 revenue program is the expected reduction, from $\mathbf{P}28.2$ billion in 1985 to $\mathbf{P}26.3$ billion in 1986, in volatile taxes derived from international trade and transactions. This will be an offshoot of further improvements in our balance of trade position as exports continue to outgrow imports. Import duties and taxes, which comprise the bulk of taxes derived from international trade and transactions, are expected to decline from $\mathbf{P}23.3$ billion in 1985 to $\mathbf{P}21.9$ billion in 1986 on account of the expected reduction in the volume and the unit price of oil imports.

Following the anticipated realization of income gains next year, the collection of taxes on income and profit is expected to increase from P14.8 billion in 1985 to P16.6 billion in 1986. This will be accounted for by increases in corporate income taxes, which will contribute P1.1 billion or 61.1 percent of the total P1.8 billion increase in this category. The increase in collections from individual income taxes will be slight at P0.2 billion or 4.1 percent over 1985, which is much less than the estimated 13.3 percent growth in the individual income tax base.

The overall increase in taxes on domestic goods and services is estimated at $\mathbb{P}1.0$ billion or 4.2 percent over 1985. This is lower than the projected inflation rate of 10 percent, implying a reduction in the tax burden in real terms.

Collections by the Bureau of Internal Revenue of "other" taxes, which include the documentary stamp tax, will account for the largest percentage increase in the total revenue generation effort.

Nontax revenue sources will account for an increased share of total revenues from 9.7 percent in 1985 to 10.1 percent in 1986. Rentals from the use of military bases under Economic Support Fund (ESF) will account for the larger increase of about P0.5 billion of the total increase in nontax revenues of P0.8 billion. The collections from other offices, however, will continue to comprise the larger share of nontax revenues.

The projected revenues for 1986 will reach \pm 80.7 billion, which is \pm 6.9 billion short of the disbursement net of repayment of debt principal. This deficit will be financed by net borrowings of \pm 6.8 billion that is, gross borrowings of \pm 14.8 billion less repayment of debt principal of \pm 8.0 billion. Total receipts in 1986 will amount to \pm 95.5 billion consisting of revenues and gross borrowings.

A financing strategy is to maximize drawdowns from existing official development assistance lines. Domestic financing will rely primarily on Treasury Bills flotation and drawdowns from the national government's cash balances with the monetary system, but only to an extent that would not unduly increase domestic liquidity.

Details of the National Government Budget

DETAILS OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT BUDGET

The budget of the national government proper that is, excluding allotments to government corporations and local government units will have an increased allocation of the total budget program from P66.9 billion or 80.0 percent in 1985 to P77.1 billion or 83.0 percent in 1986.

Of the P77.1 billion budget for the national government proper, P44.0 billion will be channeled to priority programs and projects of national government agencies, P23.5 billion to debt service, and the remaining P9.6 billion to other expenditures (that is, the Economic Support Fund, Foreign Assisted Projects Support Fund and Salary Adjustment Fund as shown in Table B2.1) not specifically allotted to agencies.

New compensation adjustments in 1986 will be made to an extent that will not unduly fuel inflation in the economy. Provision for compensation adjustment for about one million government employees is in the program, the extent of which to be influenced by the inflation rate in 1986. In addition, active participation in self-productivity programs, particularly by those in the lower salary ranges, will be encouraged among government employees to augment their income.

In 1986, maintenance and other operating costs will rise by 22.4 percent nominally or 11.2 percent in real terms. Such an increase will focus on the maintenance requirements of completed capital projects, particularly roads, and on the continued pursuit of efficiency and economy in the administrative operations of the national government.

Subsidies to government corporations will be limited to P0.9 billion although revenue sharing to local government units will be increased to P3.5 billion. Local government units will be encouraged to utilize more of their fiscal autonomy powers under the Local Government Code to promote their self-reliance and reduce their dependence on national government support.

The ratio of capital outlays to the total budget will decline to 13.0 percent compared with the 15.2 percent registered in 1984. Infrastructure spending will be limited to $\mathbf{P}4.1$ billion and equity contributions to government corporations will be scaled down to $\mathbf{P}1.2$ billion. Other capital outlays will be channeled to ongoing small projects, mostly foreign-assisted, and those financed under the Economic Support Fund. Around $\mathbf{P}10.2$ billion is provided in the "Lending Account" to primarily take care of advances on debt guaranteed by the national government pursuant to PD 1967 and RA 4860.

Priority is accorded to the completion of ongoing capital projects, particularly those supportive of the export as well as agricultural sectors to produce economic benefits at the soonest possible time. Expenditures on economically viable new projects that are small or medium in scale are expected to increase gradually over the next few years as the national government's fiscal position improves.

Debt service, amounting to $\mathbf{P}23.5$ billion, accounts for 25.3 percent of the national government budget. Interest payment is expected to reach $\mathbf{P}14.9$ billion assuming that an average level of $\mathbf{P}27.8$ billion outstanding Treasury Bills will be maintained during the year. Debt amortization represents about $\mathbf{P}8.6$ billion and fully reflects the original maturity schedules of foreign debt.

Around 38.2 percent of the national government budget, net of allotments to corporations and local government units, accrues to the Ministry of Education, Culture, and Sports (MECS), State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), Ministry of Health (MOH), Ministry of Human Settlements (MHS), Ministry of Agriculture and Food (MAF), Ministry of Public Works and Highways (MPWH), and the Ministry of National Defense (MND).

The fulfillment of the constitutional mandate for the government to provide free elementary education has significantly influenced the budgetary allocation to the MECS. The MECS budget of P9.2 billion is the

second largest among the ministries. Around 93.6 percent or $\mathbb{P}8.6$ billion of the MECS budget is allotted for current opeating expenditures and 6.4 percent or $\mathbb{P}0.6$ billion for capital outlays. It ranks highest in terms of personal services expenditures, allocating $\mathbb{P}7.2$ billion for the compensation of its employees or 78.3 percent of its total budget. Its workforce or close to 350 thousand, represents roughly one-third of the total number of government employees.

Sufficient funds are appropriated for elementary education; higher education programs; and other corollary responsibilities such as the propagation and development of the national language, the preservation of historical and cultural works, and the administration of the national library and museum. The bulk of the allocation for MECS, however, will go to the maintenance of public schools throughout the country. Likewise in support of education, around P2.4 billion is allotted for 78 SUCs. This will support the establishment of public institutions specializing in agricultural and technological fields relevant to the requirements of each region and the expansion of formal instruction, research, and auxiliary services to meet the demands of an increasing student population.

To provide better health services to our people, the budget of the MOH will increase by 25.5 percent to reach $\mathbf{P}3.5$ billion in 1986. A major part of the increase will finance the historical shortfalls in the maintenance expenditure of government health facilities. A significant part of the MOH budget will be spent for hospitals and field health and sanitaria services to implement integrated health care services and the standardization scheme for government hospitals. The major programs and projects of the MOH are as follows: the Primary Health Care Program, Communicable Diseases Control and Prevention Program, Health Infrastructure and Facilities Development Program, and the Population Control Program.

The Ministry of Human Settlements, the lead agency in implementing the Kilusang Kabuhayan at Kaunlaran Program and in coordinating government activities related to meeting the eleven basic needs of man, will be provided P458 million. Of this amount P409 million will be for current and P49 million for capital expenditures.

The Ministry will continue to adopt a developmental approach to human settlements which emphasizes the creation of employment opportunities for the people. These opportunities will continue to be made accessible to all not only by the intensive implementation of the KKK program but also with the initiation of livelihood support projects.

In addition to the "off budget" government support to agriculture, such as credit allocations by government financial institutions and price policy reforms, the 1986 budget provides $\mathbf{P}1.6$ billion to the Ministry of Agriculture and Food for the promotion of food production and the dairy and livestock development programs. Approximately 13.3 percent of the MAF's budget will be used to finance foreign-assisted projects. About $\mathbf{P}1.3$ billion will fund current operating expenses while $\mathbf{P}0.3$ billion will be for capital outlays.

Expenditures for irrigation, agricultural research, and subsidies for the procurement of agricultural inputs like fertilizers are components of the overall agriculture budget. Around P108.3 million of expenditures supportive of sugar and coconut production are likewise part of the total agriculture budget.

The general thrusts of the agricultural program in 1986 are: 1) the promotion of the Maisagana Program to convert the country into a yellow corn exporter in the next few years; 2) the development of dairy projects; 3) the improvement of support services, particularly applied research at the regional level; and, 4) the strengthening of farmers' cooperatives and organizations.

To implement infrastructure projects crucial to the country's socioeconomic development, the Ministry of Public Works and Highways is provided the highest capital outlays allocation of \mathbf{P} 5.6 billion. This amount includes both annual and continuing appropriations. Current operating expenses of \mathbf{P} 1.9 billion will be used for the repair and maintenance of the major land transportation networks and facilities on water supply, flood control, and drainage, among others. Outlays of \mathbf{P} 3.7 billion will finance the implementation of large capital projects of the MPWH including communal irrigation systems, highway exchanges, flood control, barangay roads, and the acquisition of equipment.

A program of P1.7 billion has been allotted out of ESF primarily to finance rural projects such as the construction of public markets, barangay roads, schoolbuildings, and others.

To upgrade the country's national defense capability and maintain peace and order throughout the nation, the Ministry of National Defense is allotted P10.6 billion lower than the combined budgets of MECS and SUCs. A major part of the defense allocation, amounting to P8.2 billion, will finance the operations (that is, logistical services, training, intelligence, medical and dental services, and home defense and civilian relation activities) of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP).

The Ministry expects to further strengthen our domestic defense capability through the rehabilitation of air force and naval facilities, the enhancement of the domestic production of less sophisticated logistics, and the acquisition of more advanced defensive equipment from abroad.

The $\mathbf{P}2.0$ billion budget of the Integrated National Police (INP) will be used for law enforcement and public safety services including fire prevention, investigation, and control. Other affiliated agencies such as the Bureau of Coast and Geodetic Survey (BCGS), the Philippine Veterans Affairs Office (PVAO), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM), and the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) account for the rest of the MND budget.

Special Dimensions of the Obligation Budget Program

SPECIAL DIMENSIONS OF THE OBLIGATION BUDGET PROGRAM

A. Regional Development (Table A1.12)

Regional development, a major component of our development strategy, ensures the equitable sharing of the benefits and responsibilities of the growth process. In 1986, we will stress the implementation of projects directly beneficial to the regions, harnessing indigenous materials and manpower, and supportive of key industries at the community level.

The Regional Development and Investment Program (RDIP) formulated at the local levels serves as the primary blueprint for development efforts in the regions. Although development aspirations have been tampered on account of resource constraints, regional development will be pursued in accordance with regional priorities and capacities. The high in-migration rate to the national capital region, the hub of our country's commercial and industrial endeavors, compounds the problems of congestion, environmental degradation and shortage in housing, health, and educational facilities. A solution to this problem is the development of optimum-sized growth centers in less developed regions.

The component of the 1986 budget that can be identified during the budget preparation and authorization stages as directly supporting regional programs, projects, and activities is approximately P24.3 billion, of which P23 billion is specifically allocated to basic needs. Except for the National Capital Region and Region IV, with combined allocation accounting for about one-fourth of the regionalized amounts, the respective share of each region is almost evenly distributed ranging from 5 percent to 9 percent.

In terms of the basic needs categories of expenditures, almost one-half of the regionalized amount is devoted to education, manpower development, and the promotion of culture predominantly in the National Capital Region and Region IV. Mobility and economic base expenditures also have substantial shares of 20.8 percent and 18.3 percent, respectively.

B. Foreign Loan-Assisted Projects (Table A1.13)

Despite budgetary constraints, the provision for the 1986 foreign-loan assisted projects amounting to P6,243 million will register a 22.1 percent increase over the 1985 program of P5,112 million, and will represent nearly 6.7 percent of the year's total budget (Table B2.2). Of this amount, 74.7 percent or P4,661 million is intended to finance capital outlays, while P1,582 million or 25.3 percent is intended for current operating expenditures. Moreover, this provision will be augmented by allotments from the Economic Support Fund as may be determined and authorized.

The increase in the 1986 program is partly due to the government's move to give full funding support for projects nearing completion.

The largest of such projects is the Seventh Education Sector Project (IBRD Loan No. 2030 PH) requiring a total of P878 million in 1986, which is 72 percent higher than the 1985 provision. Such a quantum increase is primarily due to the inclusion of the 1986 regular infrastructure program for the construction of school buildings as counterpart fund. The Fifth IBRD Highway Project under loan agreement No. 2418 PH is second, requiring nearly P455 million in 1986.

Provisions for the 1986 foreign loan-assisted projects reflect a high 30.5 percent increase of expenditures chargeable to loan proceeds. Furthermore, the ratio of expenditures financed by loan proceeds to project components funded by peso counterpart will significantly increase in 1986 partly as a result of the various lending institutions' policy to accelerate their loan disbursements by changing some features of the original loan agreements.

The bulk of 1986 provision for ongoing foreign loan-assisted projects of the national government is programmed for IBRD-assisted projects, which require a total of P2,844 million or 52.7 percent of the P5,393 million total requirements. The next biggest share of 19.7 percent of the total 1986 program goes to projects funded from Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund (OECF), which consist mainly of infrastructure projects of the MPWH. On the other hand, this year's P659 million provision for the Foreign Assisted Projects Support Fund registered a modest 0.6 percent increase over that of last year's P655 million and is expected to take up as much as 10.6 percent of the total program for the year. The cost of requirements of new projects to be implemented by the MPWH is estimated at P191 million, of which P72 million is chargeable against the counterpart fund while \$6.6 million or P119 million will come from loan proceeds.

Of the \$2,877 million committed by various lending institutions to ongoing national government foreignassisted projects, a total of \$916 million or 31.8 percent have been utilized as of December 31, 1984. Of the unutilized amount, \$190 million or 6.6 percent and \$185 million or 6.4 percent are programmed to meet the 1985 and 1986 requirements, respectively, while the remaining 55.1 percent represents the project's total loan proceeds requirement after 1986. On the other hand, 41.7 percent of the P20,359 million total counterpart fund requirements have already been utilized as of December 31, 1984. For 1985 and 1986, 10.3 percent and 10.2 percent, respectively, have been earmarked to finance the projects' peso requirements, and the remaining P7,705 million are intended to support the requirements beyond 1986.

#### C. Special Accounts in the General Fund and Fiduciary Funds (Table A1.14)

Special accounts (SA) in the general fund and the fiduciary funds (FF), both of which are government resources that are legally set aside for specific expenditure items, constitute a slightly increasing proportion of the total expenditure program from 2.6 percent in 1985 to 2.7 percent in 1986. (Only the interest earnings of a principal fund accrue to an FF while the entirety of specific revenue measures goes to SA.)

Forty-seven SAs and two FFs are included in the 1986 budget program. Revenues to be derived from these accounts total P3,380 million, which comprise 4.2 percent of total revenues. The total expenditures from these accounts amount to P2,495 million or 2.7 percent of the total obligation program for the year. The excess of revenue vis-a-vis expenditures implies a build-up of cash balances in 1986, which can be utilized subsequently for the specific purposes they are intended.

The bulk of revenues of special accounts will be derived from nontax sources, which account for  $\mathbb{P}3,231$  million or 95.6 percent of total revenues. On the other hand, capital outlays will make up  $\mathbb{P}1.7$  billion, the larger component of total SA and FF expenditures.

Technical Notes

The items of reconciliation between Tables A1.13 and B2.2 are the new foreign-loan assisted projects of the MPWH and the Foreign-Assisted Project Support Fund.

Around P1,914 million of SAs and FFs will be appropriated under the proposed General Appropriations measure for 1986. The remaining balance of P581 million is automatically appropriated under the particular legislation or authorization establishing such funds.

Consistently, the largest account in terms of both revenues and expenditures is the ESF. This account can be credited for 59.3 percent of the total receipts and 68.1 percent of the total SA and FF expenditures in 1986. Peso cash disbursements are equal to the peso equivalent of the dollar receipts on the ESF although the programmed obligations budget is lower by around P0.3 billion which is equal to the accounts payable cash disbursement provision for the ESF.

The executive branch of the United States government has committed to exert its best effort to obtain appropriations of \$650 million from the US Congress consisting of \$200 million for ESF I and \$450 million for ESF II. The first tranche of the former was received in 1980 while that of the latter was last year. As of late 1984, the ESF I and ESF II balances to be remitted by the US government are \$82 million and \$402 million, respectively. The expected dollar receipts for both accounts in 1985 and in 1986 are \$71 million and \$95 million, respectively. Projects financed from the proceeds of ESF I include schoolbuildings, public market roads, and other priority projects. The ESF II has a component called the Rural Productivity Support Program, which augments the local financing of rural-based projects supported by the IBRD, ADB, and the USAID. The ESF proposals are identified and evaluated by the Management Advisory Committee of the ESF Council, a Cabinetlevel body, for approval of the President created under LOI No. 1030.

#### D. Debt Service and Outstanding Debt (Tables A1.15-A1.20)

A feature of the 1986 budget is the high 25.3 percent proportion of debt service, which is explained not only by the past budget deficits but also by the national government's monetary role in the economic stabilization program. For the past few years, the national government significantly helped in the Central Bank's liquidity mopping-up operation by floating Treasury Bills to build up non-interest bearing cash balances with the Central Bank. To minimize capital outflow, the national government domestically floated foreign-currencydenominated securities which will mature within the coming 18 months. All foreign exchange losses fall on the national government and thereby exert significant upward pressures on the debt service program.

The debt service program of the national government in 1986 will be about P2.3 billion higher than that of 1985. Of the P23.5 billion debt service provision in 1986, P14.9 billion or 63.3 percent will be accounted for by interest, commitment fees, and other charges. The remainder will represent the debt amortization of outstanding foreign and domestic debt and the national government's contribution to the bond sinking fund of both domestic and foreign currency-denominated securities.

The bulk of the domestic interest payments for both 1985 and 1986 comes from the discounted payments for rolled-overs and new flotations of domestic treasury bills. From the P19.4 billion stock level of treasury bills in 1984, some P2.9 billion new issuances are scheduled until the end of 1985.

Interest payments from domestic T-Bills comprise more than one-fifth of the total interest payments and projected at an average annual rate of 20 percent, which is 10 percentage points higher than the projected inflation rate for 1986. This discounted rate is lower than the estimate for 1985 annual rate average on account of the decline in inflation rate. These bills are sensitive to the daily changes in market interest rates.

The interest on provisional advances with the Central Bank (CB) maturing on March 31, 1986 is 14.1 percent of total interest payments and is computed at 25 percent, the prevailing domestic interest rate at the time of availment.

The level of foreign interest payment is significantly influenced by the fact that around \$1 billion of the end 1984 outstanding foreign debt of the national government on its own account is paid for on a floating international interest rate basis (that is, a projected level of 10 percent in 1986) and the rest, on a fixed interest rate basis. Roughly 34.5 percent of foreign interest payments in 1986 correspond to the former type of foreign borrowings.

Debt amortization will reach P8.6 billion in 1986. It is fully provided for in the 1986 budget in accordance with original maturity schedules of foreign debts, inspite of the rescheduling agreements with foreign creditors. The said provision is required under LOI 1442, which addresses the control of "reserve money" and domestic liquidity through the abovementioned scheme. In other words, the rescheduling agreements are meant to benefit the economy by making possible the restructuring of foreign liabilities and not by enabling the national government to have more pesos to spend. The foreign liability is assumed by the Central Bank at the time pesos are surrendered by the national government.

Debt amortization includes a provision in the bond sinking fund for the maturing RP Floating Rate Notes of \$100 million in 1986 and an amount to cover 5 loans for which repayment will start in 1986. The latter includes the \$100 million component of the \$325 million Eurodollar loan of 1982, the first payment of which amounting to \$15.4 million is due in 1986; ADB 597, \$0.5 million; IBRD 1890, \$2.5 million; IBRD 1894, \$3 million; and, IBRD 1903, \$13.3 million.

As of the end of 1984, the outstanding direct debt of the national government on its own account, that is, outstanding direct debt of P278.6 billion less P94.6 billion of onlent loans to government corporations is P184.0 billion, broken down into P63.6 billion domestic and P120.4 billion foreign. The corresponding figures by the end of 1986 is P203.1 billion, broken down into P73.4 billion domestic and P129.7 billion foreign.

Expressed in terms of foreign-currency, the outstanding foreign debt of the national government on its own account amounted to \$4.0 billion, which was 15.4 percent of the country's outstanding foreign debt as of the end of 1984. The proportion of the outstanding short-term foreign loans to total foreign loans was around 3 percent for the national government as against the roughly 40 percent for the whole country.

As of the end of 1984, the outstanding loans that have been explicitly guaranteed by the national government in the loan documents amounted to \$4.0 billion, and is expected to reach \$4.4 billion by the end of 1986.

Multisectoral loans include foreign security issues, Structural Adjustment Loans (I & II), Agricultural Input Loans (ADB & IBRD), and integrated projects implemented by more than one ministry.

#### **GOVERNMENT CORPORATIONS**

The budgetary support to government corporations in 1986 reflects the government's resolve to trim down the public sector's deficit towards manageable levels consistent with the macroeconomic targets embodied under the economic recovery program. This will be vigorously pursued by improving the self-financing capacity of state enterprises with increased reliance on tariff and price instruments inasmuch as implied subsidies will be gradually reduced if not completely eliminated. Similarly, greater efforts to collect account receivables, improve billing efficiency, and the adoption of measures to raise productivity of operations will further augment the internal resources of public corporations. Real reductions in capital expenditures are expected inasmuch as the implementation of ongoing projects will be limited to those which have already achieved a substantial completion rate and whose potential returns reflect the scarcity value of capital. Newly implemented projects whose economic viability has been adversely affected by the originally unanticipated changes in macroeconomic parameters will be deferred and, where warranted, be excluded from the investment program.

The rationalization of the operations of public enterprises will also involve the abolition of losing and non-essential state firms, the consolidation and merger of those that can function as a single entity, and the divestment of acquired private assets particularly in those areas of economic activity directly competing with private sector initiatives.

The Government Corporate Monitoring Committee (GCMC) will continue to periodically review the financial operations of major nonfinancial government corporations to ensure their consistency with macroeconomic targets, particularly those relating to balance of payments and domestic liquidity and to recommend measures to improve on their operating efficiency.

## A. National Government's Allotment to Government Corporation (Table A2.1)

In line with the foregoing policies, equity and subsidy allotments to state-owned and -controlled corporations will be limited to  $\mathbb{P}2.1$  billion declining by 12.5 percent from the previous year's  $\mathbb{P}2.4$  billion but substantially lower compared to the sizeable assistance provided during the early years of the decade. Of the programmed amount,  $\mathbb{P}1.2$  billion will be equity while the remaining  $\mathbb{P}0.9$  billion will be subsidy.

The major recipient of government equity and subsidy allotments will be corporations involved in the economic services sector. The total assistance to this sector will amount to P1.2 billion for the continued support of essential development projects mainly in agriculture and fisheries, local industries and industrial plantations, and utilities and infrastructures. Unlike those in previous years, this year's program shows a significant shift of resources away from energy and power generation projects as installed capacity has been substantially augmented with the completion of major power projects and inasmuch as project financing will start to depend heavily on the internal cash resources of the major energy corporations.

Equity investments will amount to P1.2 billion, a substantial drop of 29.4 percent from last year's P1.7 billion partly due to further restraints on the real level of capital spending of state enterprises. The National Irrigation Administration will be allotted the biggest share of P150 million for the implementation of foreign-assisted projects aimed at the expansion and rehabilitation of the irrigation capacity. Around P120 million will be allocated to the National Electrification Administration (NEA) for the implementation of the rural electrification program, the construction of minihydro projects, and the establishment of rural electric cooperatives.

Other major recipients of equity contributions include the Central Bank (CB) with P118 million, National Housing Authority (NHA) with P110 million, and the National Development Company (NDC) with P109 million. The budgetary provisions for the CB are government contributions to trust funds which will be used to provide credit to cottage and small and medium industries. The NHA, as in previous years, will devote its resources to urban and rural resettlement projects of poor communities and the improvement of shelter services. The allotment for NDC will be earmarked for palm plantation projects.

#### **Technical Notes**

Unlike those of other government corporations, the corporate earnings of the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) are legally treated as a special account in the general fund of the national government by virtue of the automatic appropriation provision of PD 1234. The abovementioned allotments for the PPA are chargeable to the said special account. Subsidy contributions to government corporations will reach P0.9 billion. More than half of the subsidy provisions will be allocated to the utilities and infrastructures sector with the water transport sector, particularly the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) accounting for a substantial 90 percent. Other major recipients of subsidy are as follows: the Philippine Sugar Commission (PHILSUCOM) with P104 million and the National Cottage Industries Development Authority (NACIDA) with P46 million.

The 1986 budget also provides for a P10.2 billion lending account to government corporations in anticipation of their possible failure to settle their liabilities, which are all automatically guaranteed by virtue of PD 1967 and RA 4860

#### B. Highlights of the Financial Statements of Selected Government Corporation (Table A2.2 – A2.7)

Aggregate assets of selected government corporations will grow by only 9.1 percent in 1986 indicating a slight deceleration from the previous year. The slight growth can be mainly ascribed to the expected rise in the acquisition of equipment, land and related improvements, and the continued decline of current assets despite the slowing down of inflationary pressures.

As aggregate liabilities will rise by only 4.2 percent, the rest in asset expansion will have to be financed from equity and subsidy allotments from the national government and internal resources of these entities. The liquidity predicament of most public enterprises will continue to be felt with current liabilities exceeding current assets by a ratio 1.2 to 1.

The combined net income of government corporations indicates a significant 37.2 percent drop from P2,985.7 million in 1985 down to P1,875.4 million in 1986. This decline can be attributed significantly to the increase in NPC's noncash expenses and the NFA's losses. Total capital investments on a cash basis will be P17.2 billion, a significant component of which is the expected release on the contractor's retention fund for the nuclear power plant. An increasingly growing source of financing will be internal cash generation, which in 1986 will finance 49.4 percent of the combined investment program of the major government corporations. Net external financing will be P304 million while the remaining P8.4 billion will come from domestic sources.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS

The national government's commitment to promote countryside development is manifested in its continuing support through budgetary allotments or transfers to the various local government units (LGUs). Reinforcing budgetary transfers are policies intended to coordinate local government plans with priorities identified by the central supervisory bodies. These are partly incorporated in legislations and regulations determining in considerable detail how national allotments and aids are to be spent, setting criteria for the allocation of funds which local governments can generate, and compelling local governments to implement programs jointly with the national government.

Consistent with the provisions of the Local Government Code to promote autonomy and ensure their fullest development as self-reliant communities, LGUs will be encouraged to exercise greater fiscal dicipline and autonomy and to refrain from being too dependent on national government funds. In this vein, the national government will explore the feasibility of changing the legal formula in the allocation of internal revenue allotments to LGUs in a manner that will encourage their resource mobilization through an enhancement in the utilization of local fiscal powers and an improvement in revenue collection efficiency. The further upgrading of the management and administrative capability of local officials will be realized through national government-supported technical assistance programs and their continued involvement in the implementation of local development projects.

## A. National Government's Allotments to Local Government Units (Table A3.1)

The budgetary allotment to Local Government Units (LGUs) will be around  $\pm 5.3$  billion or 5.7 percent of the 1986 budget. The sharing of national government revenue to LGUs will be increased to  $\pm 3.5$  billion from  $\pm 2.9$  billion in 1985 to fund local government projects aimed at democratizing access to socioeconomic opportunities. The following local programs will likewise be supported: the repair, maintenance, and construction of local roads,  $\pm 799$  million; the repair and construction of local school and public buildings,  $\pm 39$  million; provincial health and agricultural programs,  $\pm 38$  million; and other development and technical aid including local resource management,  $\pm 899$  million. Local government participation in the productivity programs will continue to be encouraged and will involve local entrepreneurs and organizations in small-scale agri-based ventures.

### Technical Notes

The "sharing of national revenues" to local government units, as shown in the expenditure tables of the national government, is reflected under the "internal revenue allotment" and the "specific tax allotment" components of the statements of LGUs. Internal revenue allotments refer to the programmed component of the share of LGUs of national internal revenue taxes not otherwise accruing to special funds and special accounts in the general fund authorized under Section (1) of PD No. 144. Specific tax allotments to provinces, cities, and municipalities are funded by taxes imposed on the sales of petroleum products prusuant to PD No. 436, as amended. While implementing local projects, LGUs will be encouraged to observe the same strict austerity and economy measures adopted by the national government. Local governments are expected to streamline their operations to free more funds for productive and socially beneficial projects.

## B. Highlights of the Financial Statements of Local Government Units (Table A3.2 – A3.6)

The consolidated income of LGUs in 1986 is expected to reach P8.8 billion, indicating an 11.4 percent modest growth from P7.9 billion earned in 1985 and consisting of P6.0 billion from taxes and the remaining P2.8 billion from nontax sources. Expenditures will be roughly P8.5 billion mainly for general government and public welfare, economic development, and capital outlays which collectively account for 82.5 percent of the total expected spending. Consequently, the consolidated fiscal position of LGUs will be improved with a net build up in their cash resources. In all respects, the projected performance in 1986 will be an improvement over those in the previous two years which show a decline in the cash balance of LGUs.

On a regional basis, the expected top income grossers will be the National Capital Region (NCR) and Region IV with incomes of P2.5 and P1.2 billion, respectively. The low income earners are Region II, IX, and XII. All regions except NCR, Regions VI, VII, and XI expect a net build-up in their cash balances.

Excluding Metro-Manila, the top income earners among the provinces are Cavite, Batangas, Quezon, Bulacan, Pampanga, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Iloilo, and Negros Occidental. With their incomes already reflecting expected transfers from the national government, expenditure will more or less follow the income trends but with mixed reactions in fiscal position.

Among the city governments, Manila and Quezon City, being the seat of industrial and commercial activities, will lead in terms of total earnings amounting to P726.6 million and P431.5 million, respectively. Outside the NCR, Olongapo, Bacolod, Iloilo, and Cebu City are the top earners. Similarly, expenditures follow closely the income trends of the major earners with changes in cash balances indicating divergent patterns.

Mainly because of the spill-over effect of economic growth and development that originated principally from the cities of the NCR, the nearby municipalities continue to remain as high income earners with a combined expected income of  $\pm 575.1$  million in 1986 or 20.4 percent of the total income of all municipalities throughout the country. The combined cash balance of NCR municipalities will slightly increase to  $\pm 33.8$  million. Outside the NCR, the combined earnings of municipalities in Region IV ( $\pm 475.8$  million), and Region VI ( $\pm 267.6$  million) were among the highest. However, only Region III is expected to substantially beef up cash balance with a net addition of almost  $\pm 100$  million.

Aggregative Cash Budget of the Public Sector

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AGGREGATIVE CASH BUDGET OF THE PUBLIC SECTOR

Section 5 of PD 1177 provides that "the finances of government shall be analyzed and determined as the aggregate of revenue, expenditure, and debt of all units of government, including the national government and its agencies and instrumentalities, local government units, and government owned- and controlled-corporations," and that "the national government budget shall be evolved within the framework of the total impact of government activity on the national economy." This section is being presented in compliance with the total resource budgeting concept embodied in the said PD.

The ratio of the consolidated deficit of the public sector to nominal GNP will significantly decline from 2.8 percent in 1984 to 1.8 percent in 1985, and to 1.5 percent in 1986, to minimize pressures on the balance of payment deficit and on inflationary sources of borrowings. The absolute nominal level of the public sector's budget deficit in 1986 will be around P11.4 billion as against the P12.3 billion this year. The public sector in this document is defined as the national government, local government units, and major nonfinancial government corporations. The corporations included in the abovementioned consolidation are as follows: Export Processing Zone Authority (EPZA); Human Settlements Development Corporation (HSDC); Light Rail Transit Authority (LRTA); Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA); Metro Manila Transit Corporation (MMTC); Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS); National Development Company (NDC); National Electrification Administration (NIA); National Food Authority (NFA); National Housing Authority (NHA); National Irrigation Administration (NIA); National Power Corporation (NPC); Philippine National Oil Company (PNOC); Philippine National Railways (PNR); and, Philippine Ports Authority (PPA). These corporations, have a prominent role in the aggregative public sector cash budget.

It should be noted that the national government's cash disbursement program includes P12.3 billion of allotments to government corporations and P3.5 billion to local government units. The allotments to government corporations are broken down into P1.2 billion of equity, P10.2 billion of lending accounts, and P0.9 billion of direct, that is, excluding the peso equivalent of tax exemptions subsidy. The share of the earlier mentioned corporations on the said amounts are P0.6 billion, P3.2 billion, and P0.4 billion, respectively for equity, lending account, and subsidy.

If intra-public sector allotments are recorded in the recipient entity, then the national government's cash disbursement level will reach P76.1 billion, while that of aforecited government corporations and local government units are P75.7 billion and P8.5 billion, respectively. (Allotments to government corporations not listed earlier are included in the national government's cash disbursement program). The government corporate deficit will reach P8.7 billion in 1986 as against the P3.1 billion deficit for the national government. On the other hand, local government units are expected to realize a surplus of P0.4 billion in the same year.

Assuming for the sake of discussion that all government corporations and local government units had been financially independent and had drastically increased their internal cash generating capacity through a higher tax collection efficiency, among others, the national government would have had a budget surplus of P1.5 billion in 1982 and P7.2 billion in 1984. The existence of the aforementioned conditions could also lead to a surplus of P11.6 billion in 1985 and P9.5 billion in 1986. It is significant to note that the peak budget deficit of the national government in 1982 basically emanated from the allotments to government corporations and local government units as well as from the close to 2 percentage point decline of the revenue effort on account of the implementation of the import tariff liberalization scheme.

As of the end of 1984, the outstanding foreign debt of the national government, that is, excluding loans relent to government corporations) was \$3,997 million, lower than that of the earlier mentioned government corporations. Only three percent of the national government's foreign debts as of the end of 1984 has short-term maturities. The average maturity of the national government's foreign loans is 20 years and the average annual foreign debt amortization is about \$0.3 billion. The aforementioned corporations have a substantial amount of short-term foreign loans as of end of 1984, thereby exerting significant pressures on the balance of payment deficit. The NPC, for instance, has a significant amount of foreign bridging loans that primarily financed the nuclear power plant. Such bridging loans have not been converted into long-term borrowings as of last year.

Government corporations also accounted for significant pressures on domestic bank credits, an inflationary source of borrowings. During the early part of this decade, the NFA accounted for a significant amount of domestic bank credits, which financed deficits originating from the negative gross profit margins in certain product lines and the high inventory carrying costs.

The upward pressure of the earlier mentioned government corporations on borrowings from abroad, and domestic banking system as well as allotments from the national government have prompted public sector authorities to implement policies aimed at controlling corporate deficits and further rationalizing corporate financial operations, among others. Such policies are fully explained in the President's Budget Message.

Technical Notes

This table presents the consolidated deficit of the public sector and is consistent with the accounting standards mentioned in Table A1.4

Subsidies to corporations and allotments (that is, "Sharing of National Revenue") to local government units are reflected as revenues of government corporations and local government units, respectively and as expenditure items of the national government. These will therefore, have no effect on the consolidated deficit. Equity and lending allotments for the 15 major nonfinancial government corporations, excluding the PPA have been deducted from national government expenditures to prevent double counting. The explanation for the exclusion of the PPA is given in Table A2.1 These allotments are treated as government corporate financing accounts presented below the "deficit line" and serve as the reconciling items in the deficit levels of the national government corporations in this table and Table A2.8 to A2.10.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

The terms listed here are specifically described in terms of new technical usage in this document.

- Accounts Payable. Obligations incurred for the purchase of goods and the payment of services, or any other contractual obligations which have not been paid for before a budget year.
- Advice of Allotment (AA). A formal document issued by the Office of Budget and Management containing the authorization, conditions, and amount of obligations that an agency can incur pursuant to a legislative appropriation.
- Allotments to Government Corporation. Represent national government assistance to government corporations in the form of equity, subsidy, and credit.
- Allotment to Local Government Units. This refers to that account called "Sharing of National Revenues" (under the National Assistance to Local Government Units) which was created by virtue of PD 144, as amended. Under this issuance, a portion of the total national government revenues will accrue to the local government. Furthermore, the local government's share in the specific tax of oil products forms part of the total allotment to LGUs by virtue of PD 436, as amended. This allotment will be used to supplement other local government funds, provided that at least 20 percent of such allotment received shall be devoted to development projects pursuant to PD 144, as amended.
- Appropriation. A legislative authorization with to incur expenditure obligation payments to be made from funds under specified conditions and/or specified purposes.
- Appropriations, Annual. An appropriation available for incurring obligations only during a specified budget year. This refers to the General Appropriations Act.
- Basic Needs. Refer to the eleven essential factors vital man's existence. Technically, this represents the alternative classification to sectoral grouping of budgetary allotments.
 - *Clothing.* This category covers outlays for product/process research and development, activities to ensure quality control and standards and the administrative overhead of maintaining government institutions assisting the clothing industry.
 - *Ecological Balance.* This term refers to activities related to natural resource development and management; the maintenance and dissemination of information systems for natural resource administration and planning, and projects on natural resource conservation and utilization; reforestation, afforestation and forest management; land use management and regulation; land classification, mapping, and geological surveys; environmental planning and monitoring activities; flood control, drainage and water disposal; environmental protection; pollution control (except those directly related to specific diseases which are classified elsewhere); weather and seismological forecasting; soil classification and fertilization; town planning and zoning; parks development and beautification; the regulation of natural resource exploitation; and the administrative overhead incurred by the Ministry of Natural Resources for these purposes.
 - *Economic Base.* Concerns all activities relating to the provision of income and employment for the people and the achievement of a viable socio-industrial structure for the country. This includes integrated area development, regional development, community development and the strengthening of local governments, the establishment of pioneer industries, stronger industrial facilitation, the establishment of industrial estates, and the promotion of small-scale industries and livelihood activities.

- Education, Manpower Development, and Culture. Outlays for the implementation of formal and nonformal education at all levels by all public schools and educational institutions, including state colleges and universities (except medical schools which are classified elsewhere), manpower development programs for out-of-school youths and other special groups; the construction of schoolbuildings; scholarships and other support services for upgrading educational standards; other forms of assistance to the private sector; development communications and the preservation and development of Philippine culture and language, including the maintenance of public libraries and archives.
- Food. This category encompasses research and development of food crops including activities for technological transfer, all production services delivered by the government to individual farmers (example, seed production and distribution, soil testing, artificial breeding, animal quarantine/immunization, agricultural extension, crop protection) including irrigation services; all outlays related to the procurement, marketing, trading, and the home processing of farm inputs (example, fertilizer, farm implements); subsidies, insurance, loan funds and other outlays for food crop price support; the regulation of the food industry (grains, fish, meats) except processed foods; and the administrative overhead expenses of the Ministry of Agriculture incurred for these activities.
- Medical Services. Refer to construction and operation of health facilities, hospitals, and service institutions of all types, maintenance by the MOH, and other government institutions; the administrative overhead incurred for these purposes; all supportive activities related to improvement of the health situation; control and monitoring of diseases (example, research, disease intelligence and health surveys); and subsidies and budgetary aid to private health institutions.
- Mobility. Activities related to the spatial movement of goods and people through transport facilities, both its infrastructure/facilities and carrier/utilities, by land, water or air. Specifically, this term includes the construction, repair and maintenance of roads, bridges, ports, airports, and other infrastructure of all types, the purchase and maintenance of transport equipment and equipment depots; the regulation and licensing of the transport industry; credit financing and other forms of assistance to private transport; transport planning and policy formulation; the administrative overhead of the Ministry of Transportation and similar activities.
- *Power.* Expenditures for energy development such as oil exploration, basic research, and experiments on non-conventional energy; the construction and maintenance of power generation plants, including transmission lines and household electrical connections; credit financing, loan funds and other assistance extended to the private sector for these purposes; energy conservation and utilization projects; the regulation of oil and power industries; planning, policy formulation and the corresponding administrative overhead of the Ministry of Energy and Board of Energy incurred for these purposes.
- Shelter. This involves the direct construction of dwelling units, resettlement and the development of new settlements including land development costs (except the construction of basic utilities and livelihood projects which are classified elsewhere); housing loans and guarantees; and other activities related to the development and regulation of the housing market and human settlements.
- Sports and Recreation. Activities that refer to the formulation and implementation of sports and physical fitness programs; sports competitions; the construction of sports facilities; the regulation of games, including the administrative overhead of these government regulatory bodies; and the procurement of sports equipment.
- *Water.* Expenditures encompassing all such activities related to the expansion of water supply systems for household and industrial uses, including the construction and maintenance of waterworks, the formation of water cooperatives, and loan assistance.
- **Borrowings.** Generally refer to authorized and negotiated loans secured by the Philippine government from financial institutions and other sources, both internal and external to finance development projects.

- **Budget.** The national government budget of estimated receipts and expenditures which the constitution requires and Executive Branch to submit within 30 days from the opening of each regular session of the Batasang Pambansa. This term may refer to either the obligation or the cash programs.
- Business Taxes and Licenses. These include ordinary sales taxes which are percentage taxes imposed on the sale of a wide range of goods; taxes imposed on certain taxpayers engaged in providing services to customers, such as the millers' tax, contractors' tax, etc., and taxes paid upon the privilege of engaging in business or pursuing an occupation or profession.
- Capital Outlays or Capital Expenditures. Refer to the purchase of goods and services the benefits of which extend beyond the budget year and which add to the assets of the government. The said term also include investments in the capital of government-owned or-controlled corporations.
- Cash Authorization Program. The maximum authority for withdrawing cash from the Bureau of the Treasury either directly or through check issuance by an agency during a particular budget year to settle a government obligation.
- Commitment Fee Rate. Rate specified in certain foreign project loan agreements and is multiplied with the unwithdrawn amount of the loan package to derive the commitment fees charged by certain foreign creditors and included in the interest payment program.
- Communal Irrigation. Construction of small and medium scale irrigation systems benefitting a community of farmers.
- Compensating Tax. Tax imposed on the total value of imported commodities, goods, wares, or merchandise purchased or received by persons and intended for use and/or consumption by the importer.
- Cost of Qualified Borrowings (CQB). The weighted average interest rate paid by the World Bank to its creditors in the international capital market.
- **Counterpart Fund.** Refers to the amount from the general fund net of foreign project loan proceeds to finance peso-denominated expenditures attendant to the course of project implementation.
- Current Budget Cash Disbursements. Cash disbursements arising from the obligation program of the current budget year.
- Current Operating Expenditures (COE). Refer to the purchase of goods and services for the conduct of normal government operations within a budget year.
- Current Ratio. Refers to current assets divided by the amount of current liabilities. This ratio is a measure of a corporation's ability to meet its current obligations.
- Debt Amortization. An obligation budget concept which refers to the sum of debt repayment for loans with a multi-year debt service schedule and annual contributions to the sinking fund for debts paid only once upon maturity.

Debt Service. Refers to the payment of principal and interest on loans.

- Debt to Networth Ratio. The ratio of outstanding liabilities of the firm to the sum of paid-in capital and retained earnings.
- Deficit. The shortfall of revenues vis-a-vis disbursements net of debt repayment.

- Disbursements. Represent cash withdrawals from the Bureau of the Treasury or its cash balances with depository banks.
- Domestically funded projects. Projects financed out of revenue collections and domestic borrowings.
- Economic Support Fund. These are proceeds from the rental of US Bases in Olongapo City and Angles City and their other facilities.
- Encashment of Checks Issued in Prior Years. Disbursements arising from past (that is, prior to the budget year) issuances of Treasury Warrant/Checks by government agencies and other instrumentalities.
- Energy Taxes. Taxes imposed on power consumption and the tax required upon registration of motor vehicles.
- Equity. An amount granted to government-owned or-controlled corporations as national government subscription to the authorized capital stock of the said corporations.
- Excise or Specific Taxes. Those taxes which impose a specific sum by the head or number, or some standard of weight or measurement. These include taxes imposed on distilled spirits, wines and imitation wines, fermented liquors, products of tabacco, cigars and cigarettes, matches and fireworks; manufactured fuel oil; cinematographic films and saccharine.
- Expected Generation of Accounts Payable. The amount of obligations incurred by government agencies during a budget year and which remains unpaid at the end of the year.
- Expected Utilization of Allotment Advices. Refers to the level of incurred obligations corresponding to the allotment released to government agencies.
- Expected Utilization of Cash Authorizations. The amount of checks issued and direct cash withdrawal from the Bureau of the Treasury.
- Expenditures Chargeable to Counterpart Fund. Expenditures on foreign-assisted project components requiring purchases of locally produced goods and services, not otherwise charged against peso-converted loan proceeds.
- Expenditures Chargeable to Loan Proceeds in Cash. Expenditures on foreign-assisted project components requiring purchases of locally produced goods and services, charged against the peso-coverted loan proceeds.
- **Expenditures Chargeable to Loan Proceeds in Kind.** The estimated value in US dollar terms of all good scheduled for delivery during the budget year for the direct use of a particular foreign loan-assisted project.
- Expenditure Program. Refers to the ceiling on the obligation that could be incurred by the government in a given budget year. The said ceiling is supported by estimated financial resources.
- Export Duties/Taxes. Ad valorem levies on goods that are shipped out of the country based on the value thereof.
- Extraordinary Income. This pertains to collections derived from the repayment of loans and advances and other non-recurrent investments of the government.
- Fiduciary Fund. A government fund which has officially come into the possession of the government or of a government officer as trustee, agent, administrator or which has been received as a guarantee for the fulfillment of some obligations. Only the interest earnings of a principal fund deposited in an authorized government depository bank can be utilized.
- Financing Requirement. Derived by subtracting capital expenditures from "internal cash generation" (ICG). This represents the funding gap in the financing of the capital expenditures of the corporations. This term is

synonymous with "deficit" in the national government's cash budget. (The ICG or suplus on current operations of national government is revenues less current expenses).

- "Fixed" Expenditures. Refer to the amount which represents government's share of the retirement and life insurance premiums (that is, GSIS contributions) deducted from the salaries of government employees.
- Fixed Taxes. This category includes fixed annual business taxes which are paid by anyone who is engaged in an employment that occupies time, attention, and labor for the purpose of a livelihood or profit; fixed taxes payable by manufacturers, producers or importers engaged in businesses subject to percentage taxes; graduated fixed taxes based on previous year's sales payable by those not subject to percentage tax; and miscellaneous fixed taxes payable by brewers, distillers of spirits, manufacturers and importers or exporters.
- Foreign-Assisted Projects (FAP). National government projects that are partly supported by foreign financial institutions.
- Foreign-Assisted Projects Support Fund (FAPSF). An indicative obligation program provision primarily for expenditures chargeable to the peso-counterpart and loan proceeds of new projects.

Foreign-Loan Assisted Projects. Refer to FAPs excluding foreign grants.

- Franchise Taxes. Imposed on the special privilege or right conferred on an individual or corporation by the State, through the legislature, to exercise certain powers and privileges such as the power to operate public utilities.
- General Fund. Cash and other resources of the government which are available for any purpose and which are not by law or contractual agreement specifically designated to another fund.
- General Sales, Turnover or Value Added Taxes. Business taxes which are given percentage of the gross sales or receipts of the manufacturer or producer of the goods and the burden imposed upon the taxpayer.
- **Government-Owned or-Controlled Corporation.** A stock or a non-stock corporation, whether performing governmental or proprietary functions, which is directly chartered by special law or if organized under the general corporation law or if organized under the general corporation law is owned or controlled by the government directly, or indirectly through a parent corporation or subsidiary corporation, to the extent of at least a majority of its outstanding capital stock or of its outstanding voting capital stock.
- Grace period. Period commencing from the time the loan agreement became effective to the time when the initial principal repayment becomes due and payable.
- Grants. All non-repayable unrequited transfers received from other levels of government, private sector or international institutions. Grants encompass reparations and gifts given for particular projects or programs, general budget support or for any other purposes. Thus, these assistance are without any obligations on the part of the donees to repay.

Gross Borrowings. Refer to any cash inflow that increases the liability of any juridical entity.

- Gross National Product (GNP). A measure of the market value of the output of final goods and services produced by a national economy during a specific period of time, usually a year. Nominal GNP measures the value of output at the prices prevailing in the period the output is produced, while real GNP measures the output produced in any one period at the prices of some base year.
- Guaranteed Obligations. Debt in which the national government assumes secondary liability as guarantor. If the primary obligor fails to pay, the national government becomes liable for the amount due. Included

in the list of guaranteed foreign loans are those which are explicitly guaranteed by the national government per loan aggreements.

- Import Duties and Taxes. Include taxes and levies, imposed on goods that enter the country for the purpose of protecting locally manufactured goods of similar nature or for the purpose of generating revenues that are based on the assessed value of the goods. Import taxes include specific taxes on imported goods, advance sales tax and compensating tax on imported goods.
- Income from Public Enterprises and Investments. Include receipts paid to the government from all property and investment income such as dividends, interest, rent, and royalties.
- Infrastructure Program. Refers to the allocation for the construction of national buildings such as government offices, schools, and hospitals, roads and bridges; portworks; flood control and drainage, waterworks and irrigation system; power and communications; and other projects implemented by the MPWH and the MTC.
- International Trade Taxes. Refer to the sum of import and custom duties, export taxes, and other international trade-related tax collections of the national government. These include the foreign exchange tax implemented since June 5, 1984.
- Investment Outlays. Refer to national government contributions to loan and other funds administered by agencies or to the capital stock of corporations, which will be used by the agencies and the corporations for specific purposes.
- Itemized Positions. Salaries of permanent positions in the regular personnel plantilla of all agencies, as approved by the President.
- Land and Land Improvement Outlay. Includes the cost of acquiring land, and the permanent improvement to land such as filling, grading, curbing, draining, surveying, and others.
- Lending Account. Primarily refers to advances by the national government to service government corporate loans all of which are automatically guaranteed by the national government by virtue of PD 1967.
- LIBOR. The London Interbank Offered Rate, which is the rate offered to prime borrowers in the international capital market based in London, and used as the base for most interest rate quotations.
- Loan Proceeds. The amount to be financed by the loan component of a FLAP.
- Mining Taxes. Imposed on the privilege to explore, exploit and develop mining resources. These include occupation fees, rentals, royalties, and ad valorem.
- Miscellaneous Income. Includes all other nontax revenues not elsewhere classified such as proceeds from the sale of goods/confiscated merchandise, inventory adjustments, and waste materials.
- Net Borrowings. Refer to the gross borrowings less repayment of principal.
- Net Income (Loss). Refers to the difference between revenues and expenses, reflecting the results of operations for a given period. A positive balance indicates a net earning while a negative balance, a net loss.
- Nontax Revenues. Consist of payments in exchange for direct services rendered to the public, or those arising from the government's regulatory and investment activities.
- **Obligations.** Legally incurred liabilities which are committed to be paid for by the government either immediately or in the future.

Operating and Service Income. Includes all types of nontax revenues generated in the exercise of the administrative and regulatory functions of the national government. Included are regulatory and non-industrial government services such as those provided by government ministries/agencies. The term refers to fees in government hospitals, tuition fees at government schools and admission fees to government museums, parks, etc. This income also includes the revenue realized by various government agencies from their business undertakings called for by the nature of their function and those income generated by social security agencies in the form of premiums earned from life and non-life insurance.

Operating Revenues. Refer to receipts from the conduct of regular business operations, such as sales.

Personnel Benefits Fund. A fund for the provision of salary adjustments, the government contribution to the Pag-IBIG and Medicare Fund and terminal leave benefits.

- Personnel Services. Provisions for the payment of salaries, wages and compensation (example, merit and salary increases, cost of living allowances, honoraria, commutable allowances) of permanent, temporary and contractual employees of the national government.
- Personnel Services as Percentage of Total Expenses. Measure the proportion of expenses incurred for personnel services to total expenses and used as an indicator of the manpower intensiveness of a corporation.
- **Peso Counterpart.** Refers to the component of foreign-assisted project cost to be financed from the general fund not of the proceed of foreign project loans.
- Portworks. Refer to the construction of ports, wharves, piers, and related infrastructure in areas not serviced by the Philippine Ports Authority.
- Preliminary and Detailed Engineering. The preparation of feasibility studies, blueprints, and detailed plans to ensure the viability of projects to be undertaken.
- **Program.** In budgeting, a program comprises all the functions and activities deveoted to the accomplishment of a major purpose for which a government entity is established.
- Project Cost. The total amount necessary to implement and complete a given project over a given period of time.
- **Property Taxes.** Taxes on the ownership of wealth or immovable properties levied at regular intervals and on the transfer of real or personal properties.

Receipts. Refer to the sum of revenues and gross borrowings for a given period.

- **Regional Budget.** A statement of the total resources and total expenditures of a region. The regionalization of the national budget calls for the allocation of central government resources to the different regions.
- Regular Maintenance and Other Operating Expenditure. Refers to expenditures to support the operations of government offices such as those for supplies and materials, transportation, travel utilities (water, power, etc.) repair and maintenance of buildings, equipment and other facilities. Ordinarily, this would also include rent, and retirement expenses, however, said accounts are segregated.
- Repayment of Principal or Repayment of Debt Principal. A cash budget concept which refers to the sum of the first component of debt amortization defined earlier and actual releases out of the sinking fund for the eventual payment of debt.

Resources. In budgeting, a term frequently used to refer to revenues, gross borrowings, and cash balances.

Retirement and Life Insurance Premium. The share of the national government in the periodic premiums paid to the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) for the life insurance and retirement benefit fund of government employees. Revenue. Additions to current assets like cash which do not increase the liability of the government.

- Sectoral Program. A summation of all the programs or projects of the different agencies that pertain to the sector.
- Selective Taxes on Services. This category includes taxes imposed on certain taxpayers engaged in providing services to the customers such as the miller's tax imposed on proprietors or operators of rope factories, coconut oil mills, cassava mills and dessicated coconut factories; the contractor's tax imposed on contractors, proprietors or operators of deck yards, general construction and the like; percentage tax on hotels, motels, restaurants, caterers and others; percentage tax on common carriers whether by air, land or water services and keepers of garages; taxes on stock, real estate, commercial, customs and immigration brokers or cinematographic film, owners, lessors or distributors; taxes on dealers of securities and lending investors. Also included are taxes imposed on gross receipts by all banks and financial institutions; and taxes imposed on premiums received by insurance companies and amusement taxes.
- Shore Protection. The construction of water breakers, sea walls, and such infrastructures preventing shore erosions and damage.
- Sinking Fund. A fund for the purpose of which is the ultimate repayment of a debt. Payments into the sinking fund are usually based on a fixed annual sum, a fixed percentage of the debt outstanding cash in the sinking fund maybe invested until the debt reaches maturity.
- Special Accounts in the General Fund. Refer the the proceeds of specific revenue measures earmarked by law for specific priority projects and remitted to the Bureau of the Treasury, which automatically credits the account of the agency implementing the projects.
- Specific Taxes. Those that directly vary with the number of certain standard weight/measurement of a commodity.
- Subsidy. An amount from the General Fund granted to government-owned or-controlled corporations to cover operational expenses not supported by corporate revenues.
- Taxes on Domestic Goods and Services. Taxes imposed on the use or sale of locally manufactured goods as well as local services availed of within the domestic territory.
- Taxes on Income and Profits. Refer to taxes imposed on the sum of all taxable income earned/received by a taxpayer whether an individual, partnership or corporation during a particular period of time usually lasting one year.
- Taxes on International Trade and Transactions. These are taxes and levies on import and export goods except wharfage fees, imposed in accordance with tariff laws and regulations.
- Taxes on Property. Taxes on the ownership of wealth or immovable properties levied at regular intervals and on the transfer of real or personal properties.
- Tax Revenues. Compulsory nonrepayable levies on the population obtained by virtue of the state's sovereign powers.
- Terminal Leave. The provision for estimated claims of retiring government employees arising from the accumulated leave credits of each retiring employee, as provided under the Retirement Law.
- Transfer Taxes. Taxes imposed on the privilege to transfer properties and which are transferred without consideration (1) by reason of death of owner including those transfers considered as testamentory in nature; (2) by voluntary transfer of ownership as a gift while the owner is still alive to take effect immediately upon the acceptance of the donor.

Unprogrammed Appropriation. A standby legislative authorization to incur obligations in addition to the original expenditures program if in case the resource target corresponding to the original expenditure program is exceeded in the course of budget execution.
