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Glossary of Acronyms, Terms, and Abbreviations

ABC – Approved Budget for the Contract.

BAC – Bids and Awards Committee.

Bid – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[c])

Bidder – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[d])

Bidding Documents – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[e])

BIR – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

BSP – Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

Consulting Services – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to: (i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[i])

CDA - Cooperative Development Authority.

Contract – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

CIF – Cost Insurance and Freight.

CIP – Carriage and Insurance Paid.

CPI – Consumer Price Index.

DDP – Refers to the quoted price of the Goods, which means "delivered duty paid."

DTI – Department of Trade and Industry.

EXW - Ex works.

FCA – "Free Carrier" shipping point.

FOB – "Free on Board" shipping point.

Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project— Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

Framework Agreement – Refers to a written agreement between a procuring entity and a supplier or service provider that identifies the terms and conditions, under which specific purchases, otherwise known as "Call-Offs," are made for the duration of the agreement. It is in the nature of an option contract between the procuring entity and the bidder(s) granting the procuring entity the option to either place an order for any of the goods or services identified in the Framework Agreement List or not buy at all, within a minimum period of one (1) year to a maximum period of three (3) years. (GPPB Resolution No. 27-2019)

GFI – Government Financial Institution.

GOCC – Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

Goods – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term "related" or "analogous services" shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[r])

GOP – Government of the Philippines.

GPPB – Government Procurement Policy Board.

INCOTERMS – International Commercial Terms.

Infrastructure Projects – Include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, demolition, repair, restoration or maintenance of roads and bridges, railways, airports, seaports, communication facilities, civil works components of information technology projects, irrigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, shore protection, energy/power and electrification facilities, national

buildings, school buildings, hospital buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. Also referred to as *civil works or works*. (2016 Revised IRR, Section 5[u])

LGUs – Local Government Units.

NFCC – Net Financial Contracting Capacity.

NGA – National Government Agency.

PhilGEPS - Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System.

Procurement Project – refers to a specific or identified procurement covering goods, infrastructure project or consulting services. A Procurement Project shall be described, detailed, and scheduled in the Project Procurement Management Plan prepared by the agency which shall be consolidated in the procuring entity's Annual Procurement Plan. (GPPB Circular No. 06-2019 dated 17 July 2019)

PSA – Philippine Statistics Authority.

SEC – Securities and Exchange Commission.

SLCC – Single Largest Completed Contract.

Supplier – refers to a citizen, or any corporate body or commercial company duly organized and registered under the laws where it is established, habitually established in business and engaged in the manufacture or sale of the merchandise or performance of the general services covered by his bid. INVITATION TO BID "Outsourcing of Multi-Skilled Workers"

- 1. The Department of Budget and Management (DBM), through the FY 2022 General Appropriations Act and Multi-Year Contractual Authority No. MYCA-BMB-C-21-0000021, intends to apply the sum of Eleven Million Pesos (P11,000,000.00) being the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract for the "Outsourcing of Multi-Skilled Workers" for FYs 2022 and 2023 (Project ID No. DBM-2022-01). For the purpose of early procurement authorized under Section 7.6 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184, the proposed budget under the FY 2022 National Expenditure Program shall be used as basis. Further, consistent with the requirement in the same Section 7.6, no award of contract shall be made until the approval and effectivity of the FY 2022 General Appropriations Act. The period for the performance of the obligations under the Contract shall not go beyond the validity of the corresponding appropriations for the Project. Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
- 2. The DBM now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. Delivery of the Goods is required as specified in Section VI (Schedule of Requirements) of the Bidding Documents. Bidders should have completed within the period of November 16, 2019 to November 15, 2021 a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
- 3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion as specified in the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
 - Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.
- 4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from the DBM-Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) Secretariat through the contact details given below and inspect the Bidding Documents as posted on the websites of the DBM and the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS).

- 5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders on October 26, 2021 from the given address and website below and upon payment of a fee in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Pesos (P25,000.00). The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees which will be presented in person, by facsimile, or through electronic means.
- 6. The DBM will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on November 3, 2021, 9:30 a.m., which shall be open to prospective bidders.

To reduce the risks and hazards of community transmission of COVID-19, the BAC shall conduct meetings and conferences via video-conferencing until further notice, or until such time that the state of calamity, or implementation of community quarantine or similar government restrictions shall have been lifted by the proper government authorities.

The prospective bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx, and wait for further advice to join the BAC meeting room, the link of which shall be provided to the prospective bidders before the start of the Pre-bid Conference.

- 7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat or the DBM-Central Records Division through manual submission at the office address indicated below on or before November 16, 2021, 9:30 a.m. Late bids shall not be accepted.
- 8. All Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB** Clause 14.
- 9. Bid opening shall be on November 16, 2021, 9:30 a.m., at the given address below and via video conferencing. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity. Authorized attendees, including representatives of bidders, who are physically present at the BAC Conference Room, DBM Building III, General Solano St., San Miguel, Manila shall likewise join the meeting via videoconferencing.

Bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx, and wait for further advice to join the BAC meeting room, the link of which shall be provided to the bidders before the start of bid opening.

10. The DBM reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, Department of Budget and Management, wishes to receive Bids for the "Outsourcing of Multi-Skilled Workers" with Project Identification No. *DBM*-2022-01.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is composed of 1 lot, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for FYs 2022 and 2023 in the amount of **Eleven Million Pesos** (**P11,000,000.00**). The period for the performance of the obligations under the Contract shall not go beyond the validity of the corresponding appropriations for the Project.
- 2.2. The source of funding is the FY 2022 General Appropriations Act and through Multi-Year Contractual Authority No. **MYCA-BMB-C-21-0000021**. For the purpose of early procurement authorized under Section 7.6 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, the proposed budget under the FY 2022 National Expenditure Program shall be used as basis.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 Revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. Foreign ownership limited to those allowed under the rules may participate in this Project.
- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, the Bidder shall have an SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC.
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under **ITB** Clause 18.

7. Subcontracts

The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that subcontracting is not allowed.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The DBM will hold a Pre-Bid Conference for this Project on November 3, 2021, 9:30 a.m., as indicated in paragraph 6 of the IB.

To reduce the risks and hazards of community transmission of COVID-19, the BAC shall conduct meetings and conferences via video conferencing until further notice, or until such time that the state of calamity, or implementation of community quarantine or similar government restrictions shall have been lifted by the proper government authorities.

The prospective bidders are advised to first log in the BAC waiting room, **https://meet.google.com/hma-jmco-dbx**, and wait for further advice from the BAC Secretariat to join the BAC meeting link, which shall be provided to the prospective bidders before the start of the Pre-bid Conference.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section VIII** (Checklist of Technical and Financial **Documents**).
- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in **ITB** Clause 5.3 should have been completed within the period of November 16, 2019 to November 15, 2021.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section VIII** (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.4. For Foreign-funded Procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Bid Prices

Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:

- a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - i. The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, ex-warehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
 - iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
 - iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in e.

b. For Goods offered from abroad:

- i. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the price of the Goods shall be quoted delivered duty paid (DDP) with the place of destination in the Philippines as specified in the **BDS**. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.
- ii. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, as listed in **Section VII (Technical Specifications).**

13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

14. Bid Security

- 14.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.
- 14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid until **March 16, 2022**. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the **IB**.

17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

18. Domestic Preference

The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.

- 19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in **Section VII** (**Technical Specifications**), although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the **BDS** for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.
- 19.4. The Project shall be awarded as one Project having several items that shall be awarded as one contract.
- 19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder. For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post-Qualification

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

Returns (2551M) with proof of payment covering the months from April 2021 to September 2021. *Failure to submit any of the post-qualification requirements on time, or a finding against the veracity thereof, shall disqualify the bidder for award: Provided, that in the event that a finding against the veracity of any of the

documents submitted is made, it shall cause the forfeiture of the Bid Security in accordance with Section 69 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

**In case the PhilGEPS Platinum Certificate of Registration is not available during bid submission, it shall be submitted as a post-qualification requirement, in accordance with Section 34.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

*** In case the valid Mayor's Permit is not available during bid submission, it shall be submitted after award of contract but before payment in accordance with item 6.2 of GPPB Resolution No. 09-2020.

**** In case the notice for the submission of post-qualification documents is sent via the bidder's email, it shall be considered as received by the bidder on the date and time the email was sent, whether or not the bidder acknowledged the said email. It shall be the bidder's responsibility to check its/his/her email for the purpose.

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1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 Revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC).**

2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

- 2.1. Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the **SCC**.

3. Performance Security

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than prior to the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

4. Inspection and Tests

The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Project specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity in accordance with the Generic Procurement Manual. In addition to tests in the SCC, Section IV (Technical Specifications) shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires, and where they are to be conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

5. Warranty

- 5.1 In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 5.2 The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

6. Liability of the Supplier

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Supplier is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

3.0 Service Scope and Standards

a. Scope of Work for the Multi-Skilled Workers

The scope of services to provide includes, but not limited to:

i. **Operation**

- Daily startup of utilities systems as required.
- Daily data logging of utilities systems parameters such as water pressure and temperature, water and oil levels, ampere and volts of equipment as required.
- Make necessary machine adjustments to maintain required parameters.
- Perform regular inspection of service and utilities system to detect/ predict problems using a standard checklist.
- Perform troubleshooting in case of system malfunction and handle repair of different component in case of breakdown.
- Maintain equipment, work areas, machine rooms, electrical rooms and premises for cleanliness and safety compliance.
- Recommend major preventive maintenance and corresponding cost estimates.
- Daily monitoring of Generator set fuel, lube, water and other parameters.
- Start up (No Load Test) as per advice to ensure the proper operation during commercial power outage.
- Operate Generator set during power outage or when it is needed.
- Recommend energy savings systems to benefit client.

- Preparation of item specification and conduct of market research price quotations of equipment parts, chemicals and supplies if required.
- Daily monitoring of Job Requests from Bureau/Service/Office (B/S/O). Management of complaints and requests if within responsibility, otherwise, refer to the Administrative Service-General Services Division (AS-GSD) Chief.
- Documentation and filing of all Maintenance records, monitoring log sheets, Job Request forms from B/S/O, Service Reports, Programs, Engineering Drawings, Memos, Calibration Reports, SOPs, permits and other pertinent documents that are relevant to operation and maintenance.
- Prepare Work Permit with complete information needed and other documents.

ii. **Maintenance**

- Check-up, installation and repair of electrical systems and equipment (e.g., defective bulbs, tube lights, parameter lights, switches, sockets, plug points, short circuiting, rewiring, cleaning of panel junctions, tightening of all connections, checking/cleaning/greasing of all contacts and similar activities).
- Perform minor repairs (replacement, installation, cleaning, adjustment, alignment, and troubleshooting of minor part of equipment like bearing, belt, filter/drier, machine parts of service and utilities systems).
- Inspection and repair of roof drains and downspouts, roof, metal flashing and edge of roof. Ensure that all roofing systems are properly secured and not leaking.
- Check-up rust and/or damage and conduct necessary maintenance work.
- Cleaning of manholes using pressure pumps, if necessary, downspouts, rainwater drainages and rooftop rainwater drainages. Take out debris and clean manholes, connection pipes and water drainages to clear all blockages.
- Installation and repair of flush, shower and kitchen fixtures and repair of leakages and de-clogging of pipelines and surface drains.
- Cleaning of water tanks and cistern tanks.
- Perform carpentry/ steel fabrication such as repair, painting and fabrication of wooden office furniture, door sets, sealing doors, tiling work, concrete work and cement plaster.
- Painting and restoration of DBM facilities (gate, doors, perimeter fence).
- Repair, replacement of parts and maintenance of all DBM aircon units.

- Check and clean the terminal of all the contractors of motors, controls.
- Tighten electrical connection, if necessary.
- Check and add refrigerant, if necessary, on split type Airconditioning units (ACUs).
- Conduct Preventive Maintenance of split/window type ACUs.
- Perform Minor Corrective Maintenance found from Inspection and Condition Monitoring and Predictive Maintenance test results.
- Perform lubrication maintenance activities all utility machines and equipment per schedule.
- Ensure to implement the work according to the standard procedure.
- Undertake planned routine maintenance under the close supervision of AS-GSD.
- Inform the AS Director any and all known threats to the facilities.
- Perform other tasks considered minor and urgent/ emergency per assessment by AS-GSD.
- Undertake similar tasks that may be assigned by the AS Director related to building maintenance, repair and improvement.

iii. Audio Visual Requirements

 Provide assistance to meetings, events (DBM Anniversary, Year-end Gathering, etc.) such as, but not limited to, audiovisual operation and auxiliary services. This shall cover all Buildings and Facilities being maintained by the DBM Central Office.

b. Scope of Work for the Facilities and Maintenance Supervisor

- i. The work requirements should consider the following, such as but not limited thereto:
 - Oversee and supervise the deployed Multi-Skilled Workers
 - Check work schedule and/ or Job Request Form for the day and make rounds to check his/her subordinate regarding their assigned work for the day with ascertain compliance and quality with directives.
 - Inspect workmanship as work progresses. Correct problems as soon as they are detected and inform the AS-GSD Chief.
 - Give advice and report, request maintenance, repair, replacement of defective equipment along DBM premises.
 - Determine materials, supplies needed and timely inform the AS-GSD Chief of the requirements.

- Provide training as possible to subordinates such as use of equipment and practice "HEALTH AND SAFETY" and work rules and regulation.
- As the case may be, shall act and make decisions on the behalf of and for the account of the Contractor on the matter arising questions or complaints raised by the bureaus/service/offices or by the services personnel themselves.

c. Limitations of Responsibility

The Contractor will not cover preventive maintenance of the following facilities:

- i. Fire Detection and Alarm System
- ii. Sprinkler System
- iii. Passenger Elevators
- iv. Closed Circuit Television
- v. Pest and Termite Control
- vi. Motor Vehicles
- vii. Photocopying Machines and Scanners
- viii. Water Dispensers
 - ix. Under Warranty Equipment/facilities
 - x. Data Center and Network Operating Server/equipment
 - xi. Precision Air Conditioning Unit
- d. All tools and equipment such as audio-visual equipment, which will be accounted to the contractor upon commencement of the contract, shall be properly and completely turned over to the DBM AS Property Custodian at the end of the contract. The Contractor shall be held liable for any damages of DBM property due to personnel's negligence and mishandling. The Contractor shall immediately replace or restore the damaged item to avoid disruption of the work process.
- e. In case of emergency, such as but not limited to water interruptions, power failures, the contractor shall monitor the incident and immediately report the situation to the AS-GSD Chief.
- f. The Contractor shall submit a standard checklist form approved by the AS-GSD Chief, monitoring documents of all maintenance works done on a monthly basis.
- g. The Contractor maintains a complete list of reports and checklist to document the history of each maintenance work.
- h. Should there be a maintenance project at the DBM Secretary's Cottage at Baguio City requiring the services of the contractor, the DBM shall give at least two (2) to three (3) days' notice to the Contractor on the intended travel schedule. The DBM will provide lodging and transportation to the assigned personnel, while the Contractor agrees to provide travel allowance and travel insurance as may be required by existing labor laws.

i. Service Standards

- i. Personnel must maintain professional working relationship with DBM personnel and staff.
- ii. Personnel must liaise with the administrative officers concerned, where practicable, before starting work, and avoid undertaking non-emergency tasks that will disrupt office work.
- iii. Personnel must cooperate with the AS-GSD and the Security Personnel to maintain security of premises and property while undertaking maintenance.
- iv. Personnel must comply with the Building Contractor's/Manufacturer's warranties and maintenance recommendations.
- v. Personnel must participate in the facility safety program, and assist in the development and improvement of safety practices.
- vi. Personnel must Maintain good housekeeping at all times.
- vii. Personnel must keep the machines, tools, and workplace clean and orderly.
- viii. Personnel must keep the machines, tools, and workplace clean and orderly.

4.0 General Conditions

- a. The Contractor agrees that the DBM, through the AS-GSD reserves the right to screen and deny or accept the deployment of any personnel recommended by the contractor.
- b. The deployed personnel shall work eight (8) hours a day with a regular shift of 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. six (6) days a week from Monday to Saturday.
