Special Provisions

- 1. Reimbursement of Expenses. Diplomatic missions and consular establishments shall furnish adequate office space to duly accredited attaches or representatives of the various ministries or other government agencies assigned or attached thereto, including provisions for their supplies and materials: PROVIDED, That the Ministry of Foreign Affairs may arrange with the agencies concerned for the reimbursement of direct costs incurred in behalf of their respective service attaches.
- 2. Rentals of Philippine Chanceries and Embassy Residences. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs is authorized to use its appropriations for maintenance and other operating expenses to pay advance rentals of Philippine chanceries, embassy residences and other government-furnished quarters abroad covering a lease period not exceeding five years, and to make minor renovations therein suitable for the use of the Ministry as the circumstances and the practice of the foreign country may require.

- 3. Income Collected by the Foreign Service. Receipts from the collections of fees and charges earned in foreign missions shall be duly remitted to the National Treasury in order to cover the appropriations herein authorized, without prejudice to the retention abroad of foreign currency earnings as a working fund, including 25 percent of the income collected by honorary consulates to reimburse their administrative expenses, subject to rules and regulations approved by the Central Bank of the Philippines and the National Treasury.
 - 4. Proceeds of Sales of Motor Vehicles. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs is authorized to use the proceeds of the sale at public auction of used motor vehicles in foreign posts, to augment appropriations for the purpose of purchasing new motor vehicles. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Commission on Audit shall promulgate rules and regulations on the sale of used motor vehicles in foreign posts.
