#### Special Provisions

1. Release of the Fund. The amounts herein appropriated shall be released only when the revenue collections exceed revenue targets submitted by the President of the Philippines to Congress pursuant to Section 22, Article VII of the Constitution or when the corresponding funding or receipts for the purpose have been realized, except in the special cases covered by specific procedures in Special Provisions Nos. 3, 4, 5 and 6 herein: PROVIDED, That in cases of foreign-assisted projects, the existence of a perfected loan or grant agreement shall be sufficient compliance for the issuance of an Advice of Allotment covering the loan or grant proceeds: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That no amount of the Unprogrammed Fund shall be funded out of the savings generated from programmed items in this Act.

2. Priority in the Release of Funds. In the release of funds appropriated herein, priority shall be given to: (a) programs supportive of community mortgage, mortgage trading support operations, including loans take-out of non-members of the GSIS, SSS, and HDMF, of the Mational Home Mortgage Finance Corporation; and various land banking, squatter relocation and resettlement projects, and medium and high rise building projects of the National Housing Authority; and (b) the implementation of the Fisheries Sector Program as well as the Irrigation Projects under the NIA: PROVIDED, That the unprogrammed funds for housing programs/projects appropriated herein shall be available for programming upon approval of the Integrated Shelter and Urban Development Financing Act.

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3. Budgetary Support to Government Corporations. Of the appropriations herein authorized in Purpose A.1, the amount of Two Hundred Eighty-Wine Million Three Hundred Forty Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Pesos (P289,340,550) may be used to offset the obligation of the Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP) to the Public Estates Authority (PEA) arising from the acquisition of the Film Center of the Philippines site. In turn, PEA shall use said amount to offset its outstanding obligations with the Bureau of the Treasury. The Department of Budget and Management shall issue the necessary Advice of Allotment for book entry purposes.

4. Stock Dividends. Stock dividends when declared by government-owned and/or controlled corporations in favor of the national government pursuant to R.A. No. 7656 shall be considered as equity contributions of the national government to said corporations: PROVIDED, That such contributions shall be chargeable against the unprogrammed Budgetary Support to Government-Owned and/or Controlled Corporations (Purpose A.1): PROVIDED, FURTHER, That such contributions shall require only the issuance of Advice of Allotment for book entry purposes.

5. General Fund Adjustments in the Department of Education, Culture and Sports. Of the amount appropriated under Purpose A.2, Six Hundred Eighty Seven Million Two Hundred Fifty One Thousand Pesos (P687,251,000) shall be allocated for the Department of Education, Culture and Sports to cover its past authorized overdrafts: PROVIDED, That such overdrafts shall be validated by the Commission on Audit: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That such appropriation shall require only the issuance of an Advice of Allotment to adjust said overdrafts.

6. Debt Relief for LGUs. The amount herein appropriated in Purpose A.8 shall be used for debt relief of local government units (LGUs) pursuant to Section 531 of the Local Government Code of 1991, to be offset against the cash dividends from government financial institutions (GFIs) and government-owned or controlled corporations (GOCCs) due the national government under R.A. No. 7656.

The implementation of the debt relief scheme shall be administered by the Bureau of Local Government Finance of the Department of Finance, giving priority to 6th, 5th and 4th class municipalities. The Department of Budget and Management shall issue the necessary Advice of Allotment for book entry purposes.

7. Use of Income from Fees and Charges. Agencies collecting fees as shown in the 1994 Budget of Expenditures and Sources of Financing for services rendered are authorized to use Twenty Percent (20%) of the actual increase in collections from such fees and charges between 1993 and 1994, chargeable against the unprogrammed General Fund Adjustments (Purpose A.2) to augment their respective current appropriations: PROVIDED, That the use of said increase in collections shall be subject to the submission of a special budget pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book VI of E.O. No. 292: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That said increase shall not be used to augment Personal Services appropriations.

8. Use/Charging of Income. Departments and agencies which are listed hereunder are authorized to use their income chargeable against the General Fund Adjustments - Unprogrammed Fund (Purpose A.2), subject to the limitations indicated herein and to special budgets pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book VI of E.O. No. 292: PROVIDED, That such income shall have been actually collected and remitted to the National Treasury: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That such income shall not be used for the creation of positions nor for payment of salaries, wages or allowances of existing permanent positions: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That if the authority to use income herein granted is availed of by the agency, it is precluded from availing itself of the use of income under Special Provision No. 7 hereof: PROVIDED, FINALLY, That the department or agency concerned shall submit to the Department of Budget and Management a quarterly report of such income and its utilization, and in case of failure to submit said requirement, no withdrawal shall be allowed in subsequent quarters except upon certification of the DBM that said requirement was submitted.
