Special Provision(s)

1. Mospital Income. In addition to the amounts appropriated herein, all income generated from the operations of the Government Arsenal (GA) infirmary shall be deposited in an authorized government depository bank and used to augment the infirmary's MOGE and Capital Outlay requirements, subject to the following conditions: (i) at least twenty-five percent (25%) of said income shall be utilized to purchase and upgrade hospital equipment used directly in the delivery of health services; and (ii) income sourced from Philhealth reimbursements from availment of medical services shall be used exclusively by said hospitals for the improvement of its facilities, and the replenishment of drugs, medicines and vaccines, including medical and dental supplies used in government health care facilities.

In no case shall said amount be used for the payment of salaries, allowances and other benefits.

Disbursements or expenditures by the hospital in violation of the above requirements shall be void and shall subject the erring officials and employees to disciplinary actions in accordance with Section 43, Chapter 5, and Section 80, Chapter 7, Book VI of E.C. No. 292, s. 1987, and to appropriate criminal action under existing penal laws.

The GA shall prepare and submit to the DBM not later than Movember 15 of the preceding year, the annual operating budget for the current year covering said income and the corresponding expenditures. Likewise, it shall submit to the DBM not later than March 1 of the current year its audited financial statement for the immediately preceding year. The Director of GA and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the foregoing documents are likewise posted on the GA website.

- 2. Authority to Barter and Sell Scrap Items. The Director of GA, upon approval of the Secretary of Mational Defense, may barter or sell scrap items in accordance with E.O. Mo. 888, s. 1983, as amended. The barter and sale of scrap items shall be subject to the COA rules on the disposal of government properties and sale through public auction. The items acquired from barter shall be recorded or booked-up as government property while proceeds from the sale shall accrue to the Revised AFP Modermization Act Trust Fund pursuant to Section 6 of R.A. Mo. 10349.

Special Provision(s)

1. Quick Response Fund. The amount of Five Mundred Million Pesos (P500,000,000) appropriated herein for the Quick Response Fund (QRF) shall serve as a standby fund to be used for rehabilitation and relief programs and projects, including pre-positioning of goods and equipment in order that the situation and living conditions of people living in communities or areas stricken by calamities, epidemics, crises, and catastrophes, which occured in the last quarter of the immediately preceding year and those occuring during the the current may be normalized as quickly as possible. In no case shall the QRF be used for pre-disaster activities, nor be realigned for any other purpose not authorized in this Act.

The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) shall submit to DBM, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, either in printed form or by way of electronic document, quarterly reports on the status of the utilization of the QRF. The Administrator of the OCD and the agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterlyreports are likewise posted on the OCD website.

1. Revolving fund for Military Shrine Installation and Facilities. The Administrator of PYAO shall send written notice to the said offices when said reports have been posted on its website, which shall be considered the date of submission.

Wo. 292, s. 1987, and to appropriate criminal action under existing penal laws.

The VMMC shall prepare and submit to the DBM not later than Movember 15 of the preceding year, the annual operating budget for the current year covering said income and the corresponding expenditures. Likewise, it shall submit to the DBM not later than March 1 of the current year its audited financial statement for the immediately preceding year. The Director of VMMC and the hospital's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the foregoing documents are likewise posted on the VMMC mebsite.

2. Trust Receipts from the Use of Equipment and Facilities. Said amount shall be deposited with the Mational Treasury and recorded as trust receipts in accordance with E.O. Mo. 338, s. 1996.

The Philippine Havy shall submit its quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments on the trust receipts transferred from authorized government depository bank to the Mational Treasury with electronic signature to the DBM, through the Unified Reporting Sytem, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, by posting said reports on Philippine Mavy website for a period of three (3) years. The Flag-Officer-In-Command of the Philippine Mavy shall send written notice to the said offices when said reports have been posted on its mebsite, which shall be considered the date of submission.

- 3. Combat Expenses. An amount not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000) per quarter for each company or its equivalent in the Philippine Havy may be utilized by its tactical units for incidental and necessary expenses during operational exigencies. Such amount, chargeable against MODE for combat expenses, shall be treated as cash advance subject to disbursement and liquidation in accordance with COA Circular Nos. 97-002 and 2004-006 dated February 10, 1997 and September 9, 2004, respectively.
- 4. Restriction on Armed Forces of the Philippines Expenditures. We amount appropriated herein shall be used to fund expenditures of military personnel in excess of those authorized and required based on the actual troop strength of the Philippine Wavy.

3. Trust Receipts from Firearms License Fees. Thirty percent (30%) net proceeds of the firearms license fees collected by the PMP shall be used for the scholarship privileges to surviving children of deceased or permanently incapacitated military personnel in accordance with R.A. No. 6963. Said fees shall be deposited with the Mational Treasury and recorded as trust receipts in accordance with E.O. No. 338.

The General Headquarters of the AFP shall submit its quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments on the trust receipts transferred from authorized government depository bank to the Mational Treasury, including the list of beneficiaries of the scholarship program with electronic signature to the DBM, through the Unified Reporting Sytem, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, by posting said reports on AFP mebsite for a period of three (3) years. The AFP Chief of Staff shall send written notice to the said offices when said reports have been posted on its mebsite, which shall be considered the date of submission.

4. Trust Receipts for the United Mations Peacekeeping Operations. The funds provided by the United Mations for the peacekeeping operations shall be used to cover the allowance, uniform, gear and equipment, meaponry and training ammunition, pre-deployment expenses, and maintenance of the Peacekeeping Training Center subject to the condition that said funds shall first be used to reimburse any advances made by the Mational Government to fund the foregoing requirements. Said funds shall be deposited with the Mational Treasury and recorded as trust receipts in accordance with E.O. Mo. 338.

The General Headquarters of the AFP shall submit its quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments on the trust receipts transferred from authorized government depository bank to the Mational Treasury with electronic signature to the DBM, through the Unified Reporting Sytem, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, by posting said reports on AFP website for a period of three (3) years. The AFP Chief of Staff shall send written notice to the said offices when said reports have been posted on its website, which shall be considered the date of submission.

5. Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernization Program. The amount of Twenty Five Billion Pesos (P25,000,000,000) appropriated herein for the Revised AFP Modernization Program shall be used exclusively to support the funding requirements for the modernization projects in accordance with R.A. Mo. 10349.

The allotment for the purpose shall be issued prior to procurement activity. The DWD shall submit a written request attaching the list of modernization projects to be procured during the year as approved by the President.

The General Headquarters of the AFP shall submit its quarterly program accountability reports with electronic signature to the DBM, through the Unified Reporting Sytem, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, by posting said reports on AFP website for a period of three (3) years. The AFP Chief of Staff shall send written notice to the said offices when said reports have been posted on its website, which shall be considered the date of submission.

6. Intelligence and Confidential Funds. We appropriations authorized under the AFP shall be released or disbursed for intelligence activities, including amounts sourced from savings, unless approved by the President of the Philippines, or specifically identified and authorized as intelligence fund.

The use of savings to augment intelligence funds is subject to prior approval of the President of the Philippines, upon joint recommendation by the Secretary of Mational Defense and the Secretary of Budget and Management.

Confidential funds authorized under the AFP shall be released or disbursed only upon approval of the Secretary of Mational Defense.

Implementation of this provision shall be subject to COA-DBM-DILG-GCG-DMD J.C. Mo. 2015-01 dated January 8, 2015 and such other quidelines issued by agencies concerned.

7. AFP Resilience Fund. The amount of Seventy Five Million Pesos (P75,000,000) appropriated herein shall fund the conduct of risk assessment in AFP facilities and installations; the implementation of climate and disaster resilience pilot projects in military installations; and the development of the AFP climate and disaster resilience toolkit which shall be a guide on interventions for increasing the climate and disaster resilience of the AFP and its units.

The AFP shall consider climate change and projections and outlook and incorporate the impacts of climate and disasters into its planning processes, including its defense planning guidelines and AFP Transformation Roadmap. Funding for this purpose shall be reviewed every year towards building incremental improvements in the resilience of the AFP.

8. Quick Response Fund. The amount of Seven Hundred Fifty Million Pesos (P750,000,000) appropriated herein for the Quick Response Fund (QRF) shall serve as a standby fund to be used for the relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction programs and projects, including pre-positioning of supplies and equipment in order that the situation and living conditions of people living in communities or areas stricken by calamities, epidemics, crises, and catastrophes, which occured in the last quarter of the immediately preceding year and those occuring during the current year may be normalized as quickly as possible. In no case shall the QRF be used for pre-disaster activities, nor be realigned for any other purpose not authorized in this Act.

The AFP-GHQ shall submit to the DBM, the Mational Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate of the Philippines, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Finance, either in printed form or by way of electronic document, quarterly reports on the status of the utilization of QRF. The Chief of Staff and the Agency's neb administrator or his/her equivalent shall be reponsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are likewise posted on the official mebsite of the DHD.

- 9. Bilateral Engagements. The amounts appropriated for bilateral engagements shall be administered by the General Meadquarters of the AFP. Any material, supplies, equipment, facilities and other property received by the General Meadquarters in connection with the activities undertaken pursuant to said bilateral engagements shall be recorded or booked-up as government property.
- 10. Combat Expenses. An amount not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000) per quarter for each company or its equivalent in the General Headquarters of the AFP may be utilized by its tactical units for incidental and necessary expenses during operational exigencies. Such amount, chargeable against MODE for combat expenses, shall be treated as cash advance subject to disbursement and liquidation in accordance with COA Circular Nos. 97-002 and 2004-006 dated February 10, 1997 and September 9, 2004, respectively.
- 11. Restriction on Use of Funds Allotted for Petroleum, Oil and Lubricants. The amounts appropriated herein for the purchase or acquisition of petroleum, oil and lubricants for the Major Services and the General Meadquarters of the AFP shall be used exclusively for said purposes.
- 12. Restriction on Armed Forces of the Philippines Expenditures. No amount appropriated herein shall be used to fund expenditures of military personnel in excess of those authorized and required based on the actual troop strength of the General Neadquarters of the AFP.
- 13. Reimbursement of Expenses Incurred in Anti-Smuggling and Economic Subversion Operations. Expenses incurred by the Major Services and the General Headquarters of the AFP in anti-smuggling, economic subversion or similar operations may be reimbursed out of the proceeds from the sale of items seized or confiscated by the AFP upon recommendation of the Secretary of National Defense and approval by the President of the Philippines, subject to the submission of a Special Budget pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book VI of E.C. Mo. 292 and budgeting, accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 14. Rice Subsidy. The amount herein appropriated for rice subsidy shall be given in the form of financial assistance, equivalent to twenty (20) kilos of rice per month, and charged against its MODE.
- 15. Appropriations for Programs and Specific Activities. The amounts appropriated herein for the programs of the agency shall be used specifically for the following activities in the indicated amounts and conditions:
