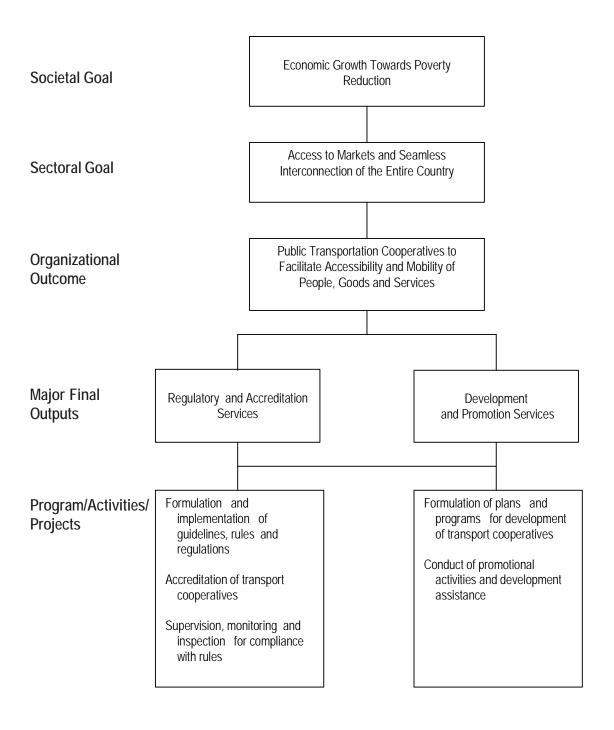
Legal Basis

- Executive Order No. 898 (May 28, 1983) created the Office of Transportation Cooperatives (OTC) to promote the growth and development of transportation cooperatives.
- Presidential Memorandum Order No. 116 (September 15, 2003) directed the OTC, as lead agency, to enhance and intensify the voluntary conversion of tricycle operation/associations into transport service cooperatives.

Mandate

The Office of Transportation Cooperatives (OTC) promulgates and implements rules and regulations to govern the promotion, organization, regulation, supervision, and development of transportation cooperatives. It leads in encouraging the conversion of Tricycle Operators and Drivers Associations (TODA) into Transport Service Cooperatives (TSCs). The OTC's mission is to gear the transportation cooperatives system towards maximum integration of the public transport system and to uplift the socio-economic condition of the public utility system and the public utility transport workers, particularly the drivers.

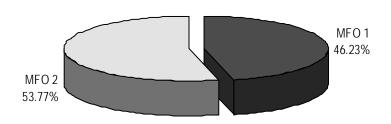
