
Legal Basis

- **Presidential Decree No. 424** (March 28, 1974) created the National Water Resources Council (NWRC), vesting it with powers to coordinate and integrate water resources development.
- Presidential Decree No. 1067 (December 31, 1976) instituted the Water Code of the Philippines, providing for the utilization, exploitation, development, conservation, and protection of water resources to be subject to the control and regulation of the government through the NWRC.
- Presidential Decree No. 1206 (October 6, 1977) abolished the Board of Power and Waterworks
 and transferred its powers and functions relative to power utilities to the Board of Energy and its
 waterworks powers and functions to the NWRC.
- Executive Order No. 124-A (July 22, 1987) renamed the NWRC to National Water Resources Board (NWRB), transferring its technical functions to the Bureau of Research and Standards under the Department of Public Works and Highways.
- **Executive Order No. 123** (September 12, 2002) reconstituted the membership of the NWRB, to exclude those with direct claims on water resources, and placing it under the Office of the President. It also provided for NWRB to assume the regulatory functions of the Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA).
- Executive Order No. 860 (February 8, 2010) redefining the composition of the Board; returning the regulation of Water Districts to LWUA; and transferring NWRB to Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Mandate

The National Water Resources Board (NWRB) coordinates and regulates all water resources development and management of the country. It is responsible for achieving a scientific and orderly development of all water resources consistent with the principles of optimum utilization, conservation, and protection to meet present and future needs.


