Legal Basis

- **Republic Act No. 9997** dated February 18, 2010 created the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) under the Office of the President and abolished the Office on Muslim Affairs (OMA) which was created pursuant to Executive Order (EO) No. 122-A dated January 30, 1987 as amended by EO No. 295 dated July 25, 1987.

Mandate

The National Commission on Muslim Filipinos shall preserve and develop the culture, traditions, institutions, and well-being of Muslim Filipinos in conformity with the country's laws and in consonance with national unity and development.
