

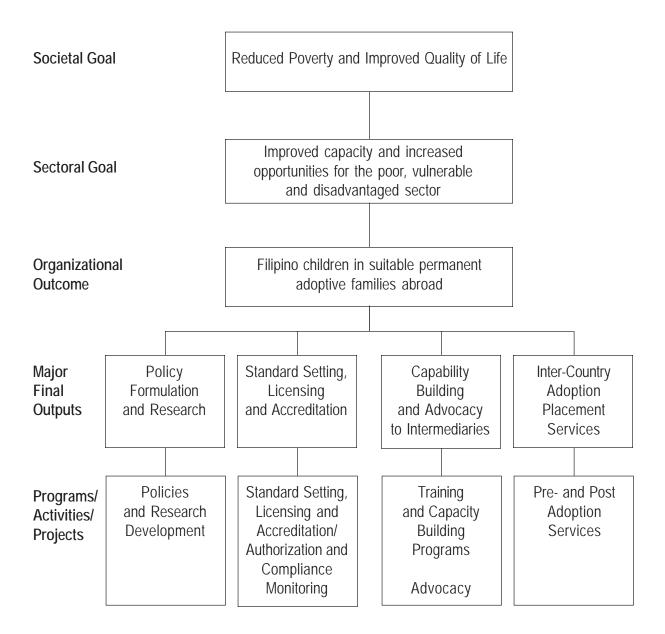
Legal Basis

Republic Act No. 8043 (June 7, 1995), or the Inter-Country Adoption Law of 1995, created the Inter-Country Adoption Board and established the rules to govern inter-country adoption of Filipino children.

Mandate

The Inter-Country Adoption Board (ICAB) acts as the central authority in matters relating to intercountry adoption and as the policy-making body for purposes of carrying out the provisions of the Inter-Country Adoption Act of 1995.
