About 2022 CBMS

- Republic Act (RA) No. 11315 or the CBMS Act signed into law on 17 April 2019, its Implementing Rules Regulations (IRR) on 20 May 2020
- Mandates the establishment of CBMS in all cities and municipalities as an economic and social tool for the formulation and implementation of poverty alleviation and development programs which are specific, targeted, and responsive to the basic needs of each sector of the community
- PSA as lead implementing agency

CBMS

- Aims to capture local-level key development indicators such as:
 - ✓ Health
 - **✓** Nutrition
 - ✓ Housing
 - ✓ Water and sanitation
 - ✓ Basic education
 - ✓ Income
 - Employment and





2022 Implementation Scenarios



Background

- PSA as lead agency in the implementation and institutionalization of CBMS in each of the 1,634 cities and municipalities in the country
- Section 11 of the CBMS Act provides funding prioritization to 4th to 6th income class LGUs
- For FY 2022, the DBM, citing limited fiscal space and anticipation of the implementation in 2022 of the Mandanas-Garcia Ruling, advised NGAs to limit the subsidies for local projects to LGUs belonging to the 5th and 6th income classes, GIDAs, as well as those with the highest poverty incidences (Section 2.7 of NBM 138, 06 Jan 2021)




Background

- Thus, for 2022, for the first rollout of CBMS by the PSA, the focus of funding is 5th and 6th income class LGUs and LGUs that have no income classification (NC) yet
- Full CBMS for LGUs under 6th income class and NC
- Sample CBMS for LGUs under 5th class

BJECT. : IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES OF THE COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING SYSTEM (CBMS) FOR THE TARGETED NATIONWIDE ROLLOUT IN 2022

I. BACKGROUND

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has been in partnership with the CBMS Network Team of the Angelo King Institute of the De La Salle University since 2003 for the promotion, advocacy, and technical assistance in the implementation and adoption of the Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) by the local government units (LGUs).

Republic Act (RA) No. 11315 or the CBMS Act was passed in April 2019 establishing CBMS in all cities and municipalities as an economic and social tool for the formulation and implementation of poverty alleviation and development programs which are specific, targeted, and responsive to the basic needs of each sector of the community.

The CBMS Act defines the CBMS as an organized technology-based system of collecting, processing, and validating necessary disaggregated data that may be used for planning, program implementation, and impact monitoring at the local level while empowering communities to participate in the process.

For purposes of achieving secure and efficient data sharing arrangements between and among concerned cities and municipalities and national government agencies (MGAs) to be used for their particular social protection and welfare programs and projects, the CBMS Council is created pursuant to Section 14 of the CBMS Act. It is composed of the DILG, Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT), and the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) as the lead implementing agency.

The institutionalization of CBMS is underscored given the importance of developing responsive and evidence-based plans projects and programs and the need to monitor LGU performance in the devolved functions in line with the implementation of the Supreme Court (SC) Rulling on the Mandanas and Garcia Petitions starting FY 2022.




